The North Carolina Student Legislature is an educational organization which gives students an opportunity to learn about and participate in the legislative process, D'Amico said. Each campus group holds weekly meetings where resolutions are drawn up. The resolutions are debated at

monthly Interim Council meetings, which are held at different schools in the state.

Members prepare for the annual session all year, D'Amico said. Each delegation is allowed to submit two bills at the annual session.

During the NCSL session, the bills go through committees, where they are amended, rejected or accepted. They are then debated by a House and Senate. The bills that pass are sent to the North Carolina General Assembly. D'Amico said 40 percent of the bills recommended by


