Anti-militarists hold seminar

Students Against Militarism will sponsor a Southern Activist Conference on April 2, 3 and 4, which will feature workshops, a panel discussion and a Rock Against Imperialism concert.

Workshops will begin at 10 a.m. Friday, April 2, in the Carolina Union. The Natural Guard, a group from South Carolina will discuss nuclear power and its relationship to weaponry. Mustapha Randolph of Black Veterans for Social Justice, as well as various Third World-oriented groups, will hold workshops.

prized to adequately satisfy that contract," he said.

But Vandenberg also told the council that it could examine the request for additional funds to see if any cuts could be made.

"If the CGC had wanted to examine — line by line — the requirements presented tonight, I believe they could have satisfied the strict, contractual requirements at lower costs, but they would have had to be confident that the amount of money appropriated would have been sufficient to meet the needs of the bands," he said.

CGC Speaker Bobby Vogler (District 14) and Madison both said they were sur-

prised by the length of time the council spent debating the bill.

In other business, the council approved five finance bills allotting a total of \$3,636 to the Advertising Club, the Debate and Individual Events Teams, and to the Carolina Symposium.

Madison told the council the Finance Committee had already cut the bills as much as they could feasibly be cut.

The CGC also approved the appointment of Bill Kimball to the position of Student Attorney General.

"Sometimes these things work out, and sometimes they don't; it's just something you have to take in stride."

Johnson feels that this year's committee had more time to get organized, which has contributed to its success.

"Band-wise, it's a day-to-day thing, the same this year as last year."

As a special assistant to Norberg, Johnson worked closely with the University of North Carolina Association of Student Governments, which is comprised of the student governments of the 16-campus UNC system.

"It (UNC-ASG) deals with issues that face all of the campuses," Johnson said.

Johnson's term as a member of UNC-ASG expires in April. He works with the organization every week. Recently the UNC-ASG drafted a resolution to protest the 1983-84 proposed cuts in financial aid, he said.

"It has been interesting to see other campuses and meet the students there," he said.

Johnson is now a member of Student Educational Broadcasting, which is the board of directors for WXYZ.

"We meet once a month to talk about the station's improvement and operation. I'm still learning about it."

As a sophomore, Johnson was a newscaster, reporter and disc jockey for WXYZ. At that time he considered going into journalism but never pursued it.

"I thought about it (journalism), but then I got involved with orientation and never got into it."

Johnson pledged Chi Psi fraternity as a rising senior. "I was anti-fraternity until I got to know some of the people and found they were a great group of guys," he said. "It's one of the best things I've done."
