WASHINGTON - After years of avoiding a stand on the issue, the League of Women Voters declared its support on Wednesday for the right of American women to have an abortion.

League president Dorothy S. Ridings said the league believed that the government should leave the question of abortion and other matters dealing with reproduction to the conscience of each person.

League officials said the organization's board adopted the position at a meeting Tuesday, almost 10 years after the U.S. Supreme Court returned its decision legalizing abortion in most situations.
