

'N&O' Editor Sitton gets Pulitzer

Claude Sitton, editor of the Raleigh *News and Observer*, received the Pulitzer Prize for distinguished commentary, Columbia University announced Monday.

Sitton, 57, was participating in a panel discussion sponsored by the UNC School of Journalism and the North Carolina Academy of Trial Lawyers when Richard R. Cole, dean of the School of Journalism, announced that Sitton had won the award.

The *Washington Post* and *The New York Times* each took two awards in the 67th Pulitzer Prize competition.

Thomas L. Friedman of *The Times* and Loren Jenkins of the *Post* shared the award in international reporting for their coverage of the Israeli invasion of Lebanon and its aftermath.

Loretta Tofani of the *Post* won the special local reporting award for her investigation of rape and sexual assault in the Prince Georges County, Md., detention center.

Nan Robertson of *The Times* won the feature writing award for her account of her struggle with toxic shock syndrome.

In the category of distinguished public service, the *Jackson (Miss.) Clarion-Ledger* won for stories, illustrations and editorials in support of a legislative battle to reform the state's public education system.

The *Boston Globe* won the national reporting award for a magazine supplement by staff writers on the nuclear arms race.

The general local reporting award went to the staff of *The Fort Wayne (Ind.) News-Sentinel* for its "courageous and resourceful coverage" of a flood that devastated the town in March 1982.

Bill Foley of The Associated Press received the spot news photography award for a series of pictures of victims and survivors of the massacre at the Sabra camp in Beirut.

The feature photography award went to James B. Dickman of the *Dallas Times Herald* for photographs from El Salvador.

The award for distinguished editorial writing went to the editorial board of *The Miami Herald* for a campaign against the

federal detention of illegal Haitian immigrants.

Alice Walker, the first black woman to win the Pulitzer Prize for fiction, received the award for her novel, *The Color Purple*.

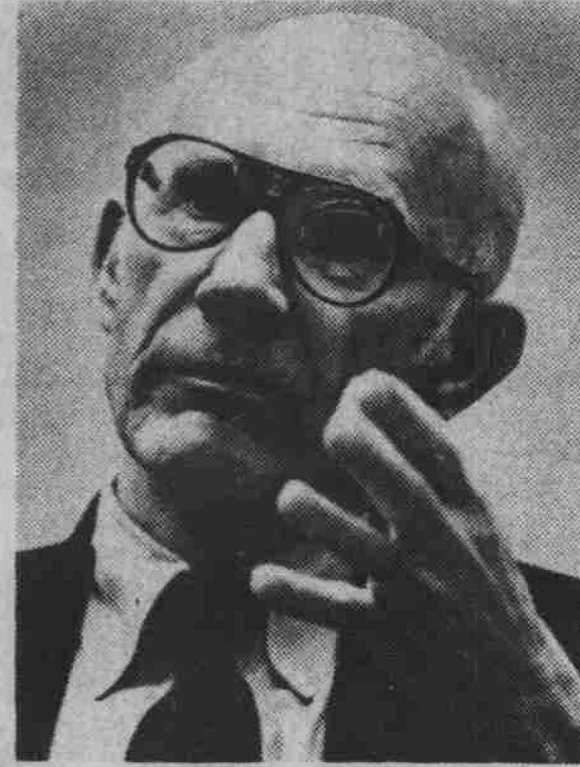
Syndicated columnist Russell Baker of *The New York Times* was awarded the Pulitzer for his autobiography, *Growing Up*. The prize for distinguished play went to *night, Mother*, by Marsha Norman.

The award in the history category went to *The Transformation of Virginia, 1740-1790*, by Rhys L. Isaac.

For distinguished volume of verse, Galway Kinnell won for his *Selected Poems*.

Susan Sheehan won the non-fiction award for *Is There No Place on Earth for Me?* The prize for musical composition was awarded to *Three Movements for Orchestra*, by Ellen T. Zwilich.

The 67th annual Pulitzer prizes, most of which carry a \$1,000 award, were announced by Michael I. Sovern, president of Columbia University, which administers the prizes.

WARSAW, Poland — Police detained and interrogated Lech Walesa, his family priest and two other companions for hours Monday after stopping their car on the road to Warsaw, Walesa's wife and the clergyman reported.

Danuta Walesa told The Associated Press in a telephone interview from Gdansk that her husband was brought home at about 8 p.m., 1 p.m. EST. Police detained the party at about 11 a.m., according to the Rev. Henryk Jankowski, Walesa's adviser and confessor.

It was the second time Walesa was held by authorities and questioned in the six days since he announced he was meeting with underground Solidarity leaders to coordinate policies.

Walesa stopped short of publicly endorsing the underground's call for protests, which sparked the arrest of at least 26 Solidarity activists on Saturday.

WASHINGTON — President Reagan is leaning against naming Paul Volcker to a second term as chairman of the Federal Reserve Board but has not made a final decision on either Volcker's future or on choosing a successor for the powerful post, administration sources said Monday.

One source, speaking only on condition that his name not be used, said White House officials are considering five or six candidates to succeed Volcker, whose four-year term as head of the nation's central bank expires in August.

The *Washington Times*, citing "informed sources in the administration," reported Monday that Reagan does not intend to nominate Volcker to a second term.

White House officials, however, immediately denied the report.

"In the strongest terms, the president has not made a decision, and when we have something to announce, we will announce it," said presidential spokesman Larry Speakes.

WASHINGTON — Describing himself as the "centrist" candidate, Sen. Ernest F. Hollings of South Carolina entered the Democratic presidential race Monday and said his party must prove it has solutions other than just to "send more money."

Hollings declared his presidential candidacy at Midlands Technical College in Columbia, S.C., and then flew to Washington to speak at the National Press Club.

In his announcement speech in South Carolina, the 61-year-old senator said the Democratic Party lost the 1980 elections because "every time a problem arose, we offered a single solution — send more money."
