N.C. tourist sites supply industry, recreation

North Carolina residents don't need to look any further than their own back yard for fun things to do and see this summer. There are hundreds of interesting attractions within the state boundaries.

"Tourism is North Carolina's third biggest industry, behind textiles and tobacco," said Charles Heatherly, director of the North Carolina Travél and Tourism Division. "Last year tourism hit a new record of \$3.1 billion." And with the economy supposedly getting better, he said, he doesn't see "how tourism can help but be better this year."

Heatherly cited many of the more popular tourist spots in the state, beginning with the mountains in the

"Most people may not realize it, but the Great Smoky Mountains National Park is the most popular park in the U.S.," he said. Likewise, the Blue Ridge Parkway, which continues from the Carolinas into Virginia, is the country's most popular parkway, with 16 million travelers a year.

Heatherly also mentioned such places as Mt. Mitchell (the highest mountain in the East), Maggie Valley, the Biltmore House, the town of Cherokee and the many

beaches along the coast as interesting places to visit. In the closer Piedmont region, Heatherly suggested the zoo in Asheboro, the Old Salem section of Winston-Salem, Carowinds, Discovery Place in Charlotte and the Museum of Life and Science in Durham, where there is an actual lunar lander.

WASHINGTON - The Republican-controlled Senate Budget Committee spurned President Reagan's offer to compromise and approved 13-4 on Thursday a blueprint that would force repeal of this year's income tax cut, boost his domestic spending plans by \$11.3 billion and slash his Pentagon buildup by half.

Five Republicans voted for the proposal, although most of them stressed they would support major changes on the Senate floor - including lower taxes and more for defense.

"I certainly will do everything I can to fight those tax numbers," declared Sen. Pete V. Domenici, R-N.M., the committee chairman who said he would work with the White House to prepare a new plan.

HOUSTON - Three Soviet cosmonauts rendezvoused in orbit with an augmented space station Thursday, but failed to dock with the station, according to a source at the North American Aerospace Defense Command.

Radar showed at about 5 p.m. EST that the Soyuz T-8 spacecraft, with three men aboard, was only about one kilometer or 0.62 of a mile from the Salvut 7 space station.

A source at NORAD, who asked not to be named because he is not an official source of information, said the

two craft were "in virtually the same orbit."

According to calculations by engineers at the Johnson Space Center, the Soviets could have rendezvoused at about 9:20 a.m. EST Thursday. The docking was expected by experts to follow quickly, allowing the cosmonauts to move aboard the large Salyut.

NEW CONCORD, Ohio - In a high school that bears his name, Democratic Sen. John H. Glenn declared his presidential candidacy on Thursday and vowed to push for an immediate freeze on nuclear weapons, repeal of future tax cuts and a return to "the simple values we learned in this small town."

Glenn became the sixth Democrat to formally announce a bid for the White House. Polls within the party rank him second behind former Vice President Walter F. Mondale in the race for the nomination in San Francisco next year.

Some national surveys have indicated both Mondale and Glenn could beat President Reagan if the election were

Standing in the packed auditorium of John Glenn High School, the 61-year-old former astronaut, the first American to orbit the Earth, recalled his youth in this southern Ohio community of 1,800 people and his pride that its young people "could aspire to anything."
