Laxmen meet up with Maroons at home

The two-time defending national lacrosse champion North Carolina Tar Heels round out their home slate today with a 3 p.m. matchup against Division III power Roanoke College on Fetzer Field.

Sports briefs

The Maroons have been ranked in the top five in Division III all season long, having recorded sizeable victories over Ithaca College and Salisbury State, Nos. 4 and 6, respectively.

UNC is now 7-2 on the year, and gearing up for its season finale against Virginia up in Charlottesville on Saturday.

The Tar Heels, ranked at No. 5 last week in Division I, are in the driver's seat for a return appearance in the NCAA tournament, but need to remain in the top eight to keep the May 18 appointment.

North Carolina's women's golf team did not come away with first place in the Duke Spring Invitational this weekend, but Tar Heel sophomore Page Marsh fired a final-round 70 for a 54-hole total of 228 to capture the top individual honors.

Page edged Duke's Mary Ann Widman and Furman's Cindy Davis to capture the championship. Teamwise, the Tar Heels finished third at 957, 18 strokes behind tournament champion Furman.

The men's golf team did not fare quite as well, coming in 13th in a field of 18 teams in the Chris Schenkel Invitational golf championship in Statesboro, Ga.

UNC's low man was John Inman, who shot a 215, followed by Davis Love at 216, Billy Plyler at 232, Kelly Clair at 229 and Jack Nicklaus at 245.

Oklahoma State won the tournament with a 4-foot birdie putt on the final hole, finishing ahead of Ohio State.

Wake Forest took third with an 866, while Georgia finished fourth with an 869. Atlantic Coast Conference entrants N.C. State and Clemson were seventh and eighth, respectively. They were followed by Florida State, Tennessee, Alabama, Auburn and North Carolina, which posted an 891.

And it was no surprise when Kumiega's roommate and weight-lifting partner, Wilkinson, stepped up to the plate one batter later and roped Pawlowski's first pitch — a fastball — over the left field fence to make it 3-1, UNC.

Scott Johnson walked, and Liacouras singled a bunt down the third base line to move him to second. Shortstop Walt Weiss popped a double to the right field wall to score them both, and by the time DH Drex Roberts grounded out to first, the Tar Heels were up 5-1.

"If there's going to be any team that's going to get this, it's this team," said Kumiega, who went 3-for-5 on the day. "The attitude and the desire of this team is gonna get them it this year."

"Day-in, day-out, it's been that way all year."
"It" is the national championship. And while Kumiega is giving no guarantees, he believes that this UNC baseball team has all

the tools it needs to take the ACC Tournament's automatic bid to the NCAAs and win it all.

"Without a doubt, this is the best team I've played on in my life."
That includes last year's ACC champions; that includes the two previous Tar Heel teams that made it to the ACC finals.

This year UNC was not to be denied. The Tar Heels picked up four more runs in the seventh on Jeff Hubbard's double, singles by Surhoff and Kumiega, an error by Tiger second baseman Brooks Shumake and Liacouras' double.

To top it all off, North Carolina sealed the day when Kumiega, in his last game in Chapel Hill, appropriately scored the final run on Wilkinson's single.

"What can you say? We'll be back," Wilhelm said. "We were just glad to play this game today in the sunshine. We spent \$6,000 chasing a rainbow."
"It was just their day."

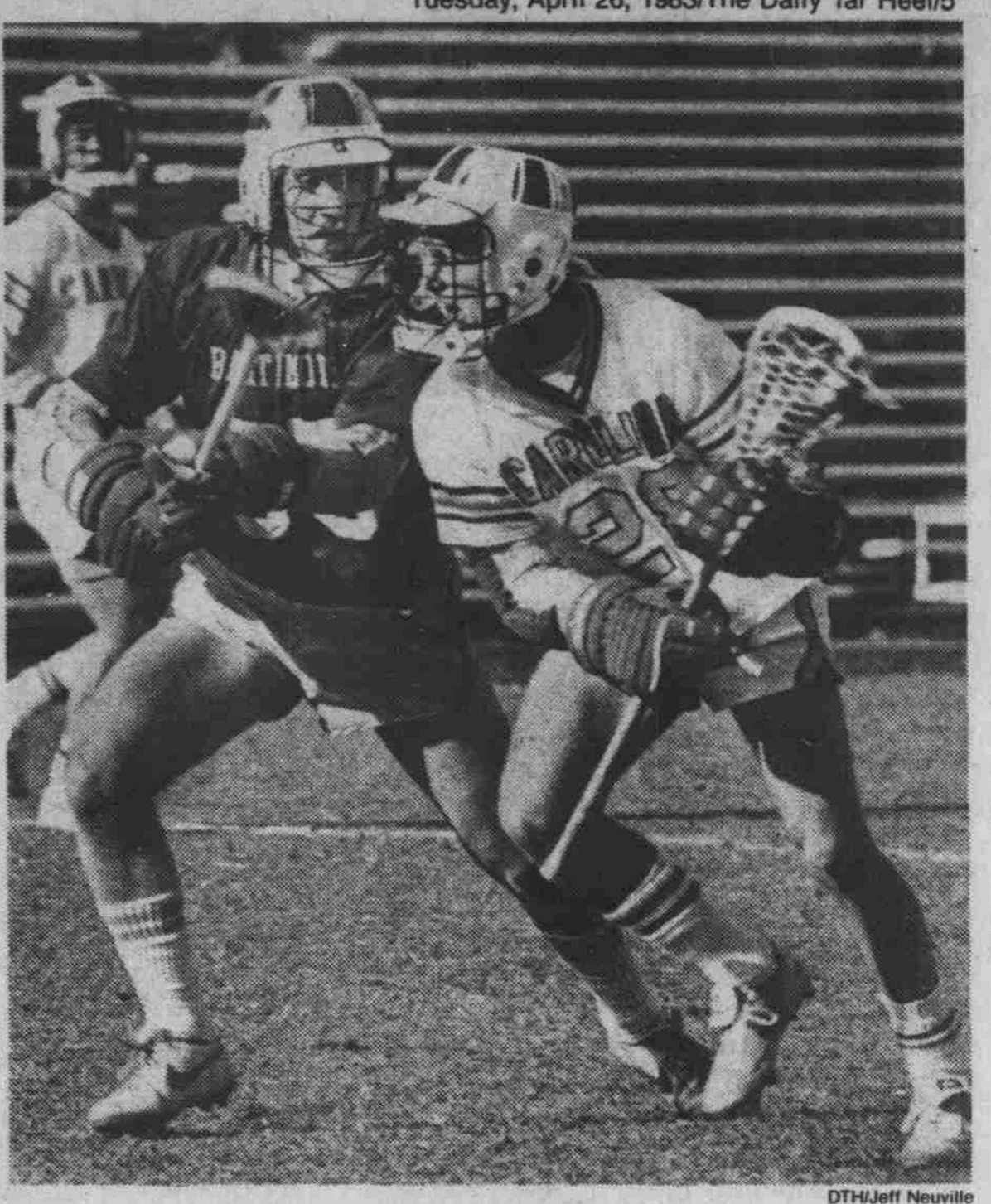
