Laxmen meet up with Maroons at home

The two-time defending national lacrosse champion North Carolina Tar Heels round out their home slate today with a 3 p.m. matchup against Division III power Roanoke College on Fetzer Field.

Sports briefs

The Maroons have been ranked in the top five in Division III all season long, having recorded sizeable victories over Ithaca College and Salisbury State, Nos. 4 and 6, respectively.

UNC is now 7-2 on the year, and gearing up for its season finale against Virginia up in Charlottesville on Saturday.

The Tar Heels, ranked at No. 5 last week in Division I, are in the driver's seat for a return appearance in the NCAA tournament, but need to remain in the top eight to keep the May 18 appointment.

North Carolina's women's golf team did not come away with first place in the Duke Spring Invitational this weekend, but Tar Heel sophomore Page Marsh fired a final-round 70 for a 54-hole total of 228 to capture the top individual honors.

Page edged Duke's Mary Ann Widman and Furman's Cindy Davis to capture the championship.

Teamwise, the Tar Heels finished third at 957, 18 strokes behind tournament champion Furman.

The men's golf team did not fare quite as well, coming in 13th in a field of 18 teams in the Chris Schenkel Invitational golf championship in Statesboro, Ga.

UNC's low man was John Inman, who shot a 215, followed by Davis Love at 216, Billy Plyler at 232, Kelly Clair at 229 and Jack Nicklaus at 245.

Oklahoma State won the tournament with a 4-foot birdie putt on the final hole, finishing ahead of Ohio

Wake Forest took third with an 866, while Georgia finished fourth with an 869. Atlantic Coast Conference entrants N.C. State and Clemson were seventh and eighth, respectively. They were followed by Fiorida State, Tennessee, Alabama, Auburn and North Carolina, which posted an 891.


