

Begin to announce final word today

JERUSALEM — Prime Minister Menachem Begin kept Israel in suspense Monday by delaying his planned resignation for the second time. But he promised final word this morning.

Members of Begin's Herut Party said after meeting with him late Monday that he promised to announce his decision today. They said he would make the announcement at a meeting with leaders of his ruling coalition after seeing U.S. special

Mideast envoy Robert C. McFarlane. Ehud Olmert, a member of Herut's parliamentary faction, said after meeting with Begin, "His mood is very relaxed."

Olmert told reporters that Begin had said nothing to change his impression that Begin "is resolved to retire." But Ronnie Milo, another parliamentary deputy and Begin's son-in-law, said the chances were 50-50 that Begin would stay on.

A crowd of 50 supporters gathered across the street from Begin's home in the

Rehavia quarter of Jerusalem, chanting, "Begin, king of Israel, lives." They waved placards urging him not to resign, including one that said, "Begin, don't abandon us at a time of trouble."

Heads of the ruling coalition parties spent about three hours pleading with Begin to change his mind.

Foreign Minister Yitzhak Shamir was mentioned in the Israeli media as Begin's likeliest successor. But Israel Army radio later reported that Deputy Premier David Levy had solid backing too.

Coalition Chairman Avraham Shapira said an early election was possible, and mentioned November as a likely date. He said he did not know whether Begin planned to run for re-election.

Twenty-four hours after Begin dropped his bombshell announcement at a routine Cabinet meeting, the reasons for his move remained largely unknown. And throughout the country, Israelis kept their radios tuned to live broadcasts from the doorstep of Begin's office.

Israeli radio said Begin told his colleagues his reasons were strictly personal. Begin appeared to be quashing reports that he had become fed up with his Cabinet, which has grown increasingly fractious and unstable in trying to deal with the inflation-torn economy.

MANILA, Philippines — The body of slain opposition leader Benigno Aquino was returned to a suburban Manila church Monday for the final stage of a 10-day wake after a weekend display in his native Tarlac province and a triumphal, 11-hour motorcade back.

Cheering and shouting "Ninoy, Ninoy," Aquino's nickname, hundreds of thousands lined narrow MacArthur Highway in the 11 cities and towns along the 65-mile route. Several hundred vehicles followed the hearse, which was battered and dented by exuberant crowds that mobbed it in Tarlac.

Aquino, President Ferdinand E. Marcos' chief opponent, was assassinated Aug. 21 as three government guards were taking him off a Chinese airliner on his return from three years in the United States.

CAPE HATTERAS — Divers retrieved the coral-encrusted anchor of the

Civil War ironclad USS Monitor on Monday, nearly 121 years after it was dropped in a futile attempt to save the vessel from a storm.

The recovery of the 1,300-pound artifact ended an expedition begun Aug. 21 and hampered by bad weather 16 miles southeast of notoriously stormy Cape Hatteras.

"It's in very good condition, but it's highly encrusted with coral, shells and sand," said Jack Stringer of the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration, which sponsored the project with East Carolina University. "It came up with 6 feet of chain."

The Monitor sank Dec. 31, 1862.

RALEIGH — Gov. Jim Hunt was reported "doing well" Monday as doctors continued routine studies in preparation for a gall bladder operation, possibly as early as today, an aide said.

Press Secretary Gary Pearce said Dr. Larry Tyree, the governor's personal physician, saw Hunt on Monday and

said he found no problems.

Tyree said Hunt is in excellent health and he expects the surgery to be routine.

Tyree said a patient is normally hospitalized for about a week after such an operation, but it would be several weeks before Hunt could resume his full schedule.

Orange County tied with Allegheny County for the lowest unemployment rate in the state in July, recording a 4.2 percent jobless rate.

Of a total work force of 47,100, Orange County had 1,970 residents out of work last month.

Graham County registered the highest unemployment rate in July, with 18.3 percent of the work force unemployed.

The statewide rate was 8.6 percent in July, up 0.1 percent from June. The national jobless rate was 9.4 percent in July.

The unemployment rate jumped in 47 counties in July, declined in 43 and remained the same in 10.
