If Edmisten is the front-runner in the race, the dark horse could be former state legislator Tom Gilmore. But Harry Kaplan, a law student from Winston-Salem, members of Young Voters for Gilmore, hope that solid grass-roots campaigning can change all that.

"I not only think he can win, I think he will win," Kaplan said.

Young Voters for Gilmore is unique among student campaign groups in that most of its core membership, including Kaplan, consists of law students. Kaplan said one reason Gilmore appeals to law students may be that he was "accused of

being a lawyer" during his six years in the N.C. House of Representatives because he sponsored many bills dealing with legislation ethics.

Successful campaigning hinged on two factors, Kaplan said — a strong campaign organization and enough funds to stay competitive in the media. Gilmore's candidacy is Kaplan's first priority this year, he said.

The Gilmore organization plans hard, grass-roots work, including a big push during student registration in January, a regular table in the Pit and a phone bank, Kaplan said.

"Gilmore is the natural candidate for young voters because his record proves he supports access to government for everyone."

Joe D'Amico, a senior from Charlotte, is President of Eddie Knox's UNC campus campaign. D'Amico thinks the Charlotte mayor is the candidate student voters should turn to. Knox's support for education and his vision for the state should make him attractive to young voters, D'Amico said.

"We're an important source of ideas for the whole campaign," D'Amico said.

The UNC organization participates in Volunteer Night each Wednesday and brainstorming sessions each Tuesday at Knox's Raleigh office.

D'Amico said there are about 20 core members in his group, including Knox's nephew, Steve Knox. "We've got so many people who are so dedicated... we really can delegate."

Though it may be too early to see any real trends in the governor's race, D'Amico said he was very confident Knox could win the Democratic nomination.

ST. GEORGE'S, Grenada — Sir Paul Scoon, Grenada's governor general, appointed a nine-member advisory council Wednesday, and U.S. forces exchanged fire with several snipers for the first time in four days.

Maj. Douglas Frey, a U.S. military spokesman, said five or six men opened fire with automatic weapons on seven soldiers from the 82nd Airborne Division manning a roadblock Wednesday morning. He said the Americans scattered and returned the fire, but there were no casualties.

Scoon appointed the advisory council to serve as a provisional government and prepare for elections.

No elections have been held since a revolutionary government seized power 4½ years ago.

Scoon is recognized as Grenada's constitutional authority by the United States and eastern Caribbean nations who invaded Oct. 25.

TOKYO — President Reagan, welcomed by Emperor Hirohito and flag-waving school children, cautioned his hosts Wednesday that failure to settle trade disputes between the United States and Japan could damage their political relations.

Reagan arrived for three days of critical talks with Japanese officials on trade, defense, energy and finance issues.

After a formal welcoming ceremony under gray skies in the courtyard of the ornate Akasaka Palace, Reagan toured the Imperial Palace with the 82-year-old Hirohito and held the first of two business meetings with Prime Minister Yasuhiro Nakasone.

Political analysts say Democrat Harvey Gantt's election as Charlotte's first black mayor will make Gantt a focal point as the state and country enter a banner political year.

Gantt, a 40-year-old architect, defeated his white Republican opponent, Ed Peacock, with 43,569 votes or 52 percent of the vote to 39,536 votes or 48 percent. Gantt captured almost 40 percent of the white vote cast in the city, where blacks make up 23 percent of registered voters.






