

Consulting policy study will focus on conflicts of interest

William C. Friday, president of the UNC system, recently informed the Board of Governors that he will re-examine the system's policy involving outside consulting by its faculty members. Friday said he expects to report his results in February 1984.

A series of articles in the *Raleigh News and Observer* was the impetus that led him to review the system's consulting policy, Friday said. The *News and Observer's* series indicated "weaknesses and defects in the administration of the policy," he told the Board last week.

Although the *News and Observer's* story dealt only with this University and N.C. State University, Friday said the review would encompass all of the 16 campuses in the UNC system.

"Deans and department heads will be given guidance to insure consistency and clarity in carrying out the policy in their respective units," Friday said, adding that the institution regularly will review the operation of the policy to ascertain its effectiveness and the overall level of activity.

He told the Board that the issues involving possible conflicts of interest may be what the institution and the profession must protect themselves against. He cited

changing technology and changing relationships between the University and private industry as issues which are raising questions about the consulting policy—questions which did not seem pertinent in 1979, the year the consulting policy was originated.

"We are going to examine the whole area of conflict of interest," Friday said. "That (conflict of interest) relates to the relationship a member of the faculty might have with an outside company."

"We don't know yet what changes in the policy may be made until we get into the evidence that may be there," he said. "We will not know anything until we examine the records."

Friday said that the *News and Observer* series revealed some evidence of faculty members ignoring the policy.

"The study indicates that some people did not file the letter of intent, which tells the dean where the consulting will be done," he said. "That is the basic requirement of the standing policy."

Friday also commented on the positive aspects of outside consulting that the *News and Observer* series brought out. He said outside consulting strengthens the system's teaching and research programs and, through consultation scores of faculty members make their knowledge and skills available to government and to industry.

NICOSIA, Cyprus — President Spyros Kyprianou on Wednesday ruled out the use of force to reunify Cyprus, but Greek and Turkish troops were reported on alert after the Turkish-occupied sector of the island declared itself independent.

Kyprianou indicated he would ask the U.N. Security Council to impose sanctions against Turkey and northern Cyprus.

Turkey, which invaded the Mediterranean island in 1974, has 25,000 troops in the newly-declared Turkish Republic of Northern Cyprus — troops sent nine years ago, ostensibly to protect the rights of Cyprus' ethnic Turkish minority.

In Athens, Greek government spokesman Dimitrios Maroudas told reporters the Socialist government was not contemplating declaring a mobilization or sending warships to Cyprus in reaction to the Turkish Cypriot move.

He also refused to say whether the documents were found in the Reagan campaign archives in the Hoover Institution at Stanford University or in personal files maintained by former Reagan campaign staffers.

WASHINGTON — President Reagan won't ask for authority to keep U.S. troops in Grenada past the Christmas deadline set by Congress because the administration expects all combat forces to be withdrawn before then, a White House spokesman said Wednesday.

House and Senate leaders are split on whether to allow American forces to remain on the island under the War Powers Act. But the administration's plan would avoid another confrontation like the one that resulted in the compromise with Congress in September in Lebanon for 18 more months.

WASHINGTON — The Senate began an uncertain effort Wednesday to pass a multibillion-dollar package of increased taxes and spending cuts that the Budget Committee chairman said offers the last hope this year of doing anything to trim budget deficits.

On the Senate floor, debate began on a \$28 billion deficit-reduction package comprising \$14.6 billion in spending cuts and \$13.4 billion in tax increases.

In the Senate Finance Committee, consideration began on a \$150 billion deficit-reduction bill proposed by Sen. Robert Dole, R-Kan. The measure calls for higher taxes on middle- and upper-income Americans, a new levy on most types of energy and restraints on growth of federal health programs.

WASHINGTON — Highly classified documents from the Carter administration have been found by congressional investigators in files from President Reagan's 1980 election campaign, a House subcommittee chairman said Wednesday.

"We've found some 'your eyes only' type of stuff. That means classified — the highest classification," said Rep. Donald J. Albosta, D-Mich., whose panel is probing how Carter White House materials reached the president's campaign.

Albosta, who announced that he has set Jan. 26 as the tentative start for

Greene nodded. Reinhard and Maslia differed over whether the money allocated to the choir actually served to fund "programs, activities or events" as defined in the Student Constitution.

Reinhard said the money, although used only for transportation and technical costs, was essential to the choir's performances.

CCC Finance Committee Chairman Doc Droze (Dis-

trict 22) testified that the wording of the constitution was consistent with the CCG's philosophy of funding programs rather than organizations. They fund the particular program, not the organization as such.

Maslia said he could not see how purchases of things such as gasoline could be seen as supporting religion.

"Not only are they not religious in nature, I don't see how they are religious at all," he said.
