# State and Nation

**SARAJEVO, Yugoslavia** — The XIV Olympic Winter Games officially opened Wednesday with the lighting of the Olympic flame. About 1,500 athletes representing a record 49 countries marched in a magnificent procession to the sounds of pop and disco, to Beethoven, Mozart and Bach.

Skiers, skaters and sled racers from Mongolia to Iceland got a warm reception from the 50,000 spectators who filled Kosevo Stadium for the lavish pageant.

But the crowd reserved its biggest cheer for the lighting of the Olympic torch, at 3:37 p.m., local time. The honor went to 19-year-old Yugoslav figure skater Sanda Dubravcic after she trotted 94 steps up a white platform to where the flame will burn in a huge bowl for the duration of the Games.

"Havla, Sarajevo, Havla, Yugoslavia," Juan Antonio Samaranch, president of the International Olympic Committee, said. "Thank You, Sarajevo. Thank You, Yugoslavia."

**CAPE CANAVERAL, Fla.** — Challenger's space walkers refueled their backpacks Wednesday for an encores venture into the cargo bay, while officials on the ground worried that rain and clouds might prevent the first Florida shuttle landing on Saturday.

Mission Control told the crew that "you're the talk of the world" after the spectacular excursion that Bruce McCandless and Robert Stewart made

into space Tuesday without a rope connecting them to the shuttle.

McCandless and Stewart are scheduled for a second walk beginning at 6 a.m. EST Thursday, but their three fellow astronauts joked they might fight for the chance "to share all the good deals."

**WINSTON-SALEM** — Defense attorneys Wednesday attacked the truthfulness of former Klansman Chris Benson, who said he agreed to testify against nine Klansmen and Nazis because he couldn't go on "covering up for them."

Benson, who testified he became an FBI informant after the Nov. 3, 1979 shootings of five communists in Greensboro, did not appear in the 1980 state murder trial stemming from the slayings.

State prosecutors say they didn't know of Benson's law enforcement role until this week.

"I was tired of lies," Benson said. "I decided in the room that I couldn't go on telling lies covering up for them."

**JACKSONVILLE** — President Reagan's plan to gradually withdraw embattled Marines from Beirut brought approval from soldiers' wives back home but drew warnings from some North Carolina congressmen.

"I think they should have done it a long time ago. We went over there for a purpose and now that the government is falling apart it is time for them to pull out," said one wife, who asked not to be identified.

Reagan announced Tuesday he had ordered the gradual removal of the Marines to warships off the Lebanese shore. He also gave the U.S. fleet broad discretion to mount naval and air attacks on anyone firing on Beirut from areas controlled by Syria.
