Elections Board for submitting his campaign financial statement 35-40 minutes past the deadline, a decision that was later overturned by the Student Supreme Court. Their decision was for a re-election, held yesterday.

After talking with "many" students, Hiday said he believed the disqualification issue did not hurt his chances.

Hiday said he planned to start working on organizing his editorial staff immediately, and he said he was lucky to be

inheriting this staff.

"As the new editor, I feel extremely fortunate that we have so many talented editors coming back. This year we have more coming back than usual."

"I'd like to say that I am looking forward to working with John Conway, whom I expect will work at the DTH in a major way," Hiday added. Conway, who finished third in the original election February 14, gave his support to Hiday after deciding not to run again this time around.

NICOSIA, Cyprus — Iraq claimed on Tuesday it had won the biggest victory of the 3½-year war by crushing an Iranian offensive and driving Iranian forces back across the border near the southern city of Basra.

"Iraq's flag was hoisted at the last fortified position held by the Iranians at the Iraqi village of al Beidha... and all enemy forces have been crushed except for those who surrendered," a battle commander said in a cable to Iraqi President Saddam Hussein. The contents of the cable were broadcast by the official Iraqi News Agency and monitored in Cyprus.

WASHINGTON — President Reagan's special Mideast envoy,

Donald Rumsfeld, is expected to resign after one more trip to the region, partly out of frustration that American policy in Lebanon hasn't worked, informed U.S. officials said Tuesday.

The post is likely to go to State Department consultant Laurence Silberman, the former ambassador to Yugoslavia who will accompany Rumsfeld on his next trip to the region, said a senior official, who insisted on anonymity.

RALEIGH — Mario Evangelista Navas Villabona, who held authorities at bay for three days aboard the train where his sister and infant nephew perished, was sentenced to life imprisonment Tuesday by the jury that convicted him of murder.

The Wake County Superior Court jury, rejecting the prosecution's call for the death penalty, decided after deliberating 40 minutes that Navas had not committed an unusually heinous or cruel act when he allowed the 8-month-old boy to die of dehydration.
