

Lee opens Orange County campaign office

Touting a new poll which shows him in a dead heat with incumbent Rep. Ike Andrews in the 4th District congressional race, Howard Lee officially opened his Orange County campaign office here in The Courtyard development on West Franklin Street.

"We have completed a poll which shows that Ike Andrews and Howard Lee are running neck and neck with 32 percent support," Lee said of the poll conducted by Calumet Research Inc. of Durham.

According to Calumet pollster Jim O'Reilly, Lee and Andrews are tied with 32 percent, while the other Democratic

challenger, John Winters Jr., has 8 percent of the 410 Democrats surveyed in the 4th District who said they would vote in the May 8 primary.

O'Reilly said results from the poll still are being analyzed, but added that the overall message coming from voters is two-fold — Republican 4th District candidate Bill Cobey is pulling Democratic support from Andrews, and Lee is becoming a popular alternative to Andrews in the primary.

"There's been a net shift in Democrats saying they'd vote for Cobey rather than Ike," O'Reilly said. "Against Bill Cobey in a race, Ike's got substantial trouble."

A Lee-Cobey race wasn't figured into the poll, he said, because Lee has got to make it through the primary battle with

Andrews and Winters.

"The presence of Winters is going to force a runoff in all probability," O'Reilly said, "and runoffs have been a disaster for black candidates."

Lee, a former Chapel Hill mayor, called the poll "encouraging" and said he had an excellent chance to draw support from Winters and the 28 percent undecided block.

"Many of the black leaders in Raleigh (Winters' base of support) have begun to come over into my camp, and I have a majority of the people in Raleigh," Lee said.

O'Reilly said the picture of Andrews that emerged from the poll reflected fallout from his drunken driving conviction in 1982. "Ike's personal missteps are

not forgotten. Voters don't see him as a man who pulls his weight in Washington. He's disrespected by his constituents."

The theme that Andrews separates himself from constituents has become the central issue of Lee's campaign. He returned to it again in opening the Orange County headquarters in Chapel Hill. "Neither of my challengers have opened an office," he said.

"A campaign office is a symbol of a candidates' willingness to discuss issues with the people."

Lee said his co-chairmen in Orange County would Carol Ann Zinn, developer of The Courtyard, and the Rev. B. Willis Wilson II of St. Paul's AME Church in Carrboro.

N.C. tornado kills four

Tornadoes roared through Scotland, Robeson and Wayne counties in southern and eastern North Carolina, Wednesday night, authorities said.

Scotland County emergency officials said four people were killed there when a twister touched down. Tornadoes also struck the Robeson County towns of Maxton, Shannon, Red Springs and Parkton and hit Mount Olive in Wayne County. Officials said at least 40 people had been hurt in Mount Olive and 10 to 20 were injured in Maxton and Red Springs.

Salvador aid vote

WASHINGTON — A Democratic leader predicted on Wednesday Senate approval of a compromise \$61.7 million military aid package for El Salvador, but Secretary of State George P. Shultz said he would resist any move to cut off the aid if the government now being chosen is overthrown in a military coup.

"I think it is not necessary and is in-

appropriate to seem to be predicting that possibility," Shultz said. "The military in El Salvador has gone to great lengths to depoliticize themselves. I don't see any evidence of anything to the contrary."

Shultz made his remarks to the Senate Appropriations subcommittee that oversees the State Department budget.

In El Salvador, long-delayed presidential election returns mounted slowly Wednesday, putting centrist Jose Napoleon Duarte into the lead but making a May runoff with arch-conservative Roberto d'Aubuisson almost a certainty.

BEIRUT — In the worst violence since a cease-fire was declared March 13, 30 people were killed and more than 100 wounded as artillery shells and rockets pounded Christian and Moslem residential areas in Beirut.
