

Carrington, Morgan address students

Two political figures — one a newcomer to politics, the other a former U.S. Senator — made appearances Tuesday night in the Carolina Union.

John Carrington, a Republican candidate for lieutenant governor, spoke before the UNC College Republicans, while former Democratic Sen. Robert Morgan addressed the UNC Young Democrats.

Carrington is seeking public office for the first time. He said he was running for lieutenant governor because he is concerned with what happens in this state, and as lieutenant governor he could influence what happens in the state capitol.

"We are collecting more taxes than we need for two United States, and they are being used ineffectively," Carrington said. The first tax that should be eliminated is the sales tax on food, he said, adding that he proposed to increase taxes on luxuries. But he said he did not support a tax on cigarettes.

Carrington also said he supported a 10 percent pay raise proposed for teachers. But increasing teachers' pay will not solve the problems in the educational system, he said.

Morgan, who served from 1974-80 as a North Carolina senator, emphasized Walter Mondale's campaign for president in his speech before the Young Democrats. Mondale's experience as a former Minnesota attorney general, U.S. senator and vice president makes him the strongest challenger to President Reagan in November, Morgan said.

"Mondale has been in the mainstream of the Democratic Party for a long time," said Morgan, Mondale's N.C. campaign director. "Maybe he doesn't have the charisma that (Gary) Hart has, but with Hart, we are electing a man we just don't know that much about."

Morgan said his two years in the Senate with Mondale had changed an initial bad impression. "I went to Washington with the full intention of not liking Fritz Mondale ... but I have come to admire him for his great intellect and personal integrity."

Mondale also is committed to improving education, preventing cutbacks in social programs and making the tax structure equitable, Morgan said. "If you're in the \$20-30,000 tax bracket, you get enough back to buy the wheel of a Cadillac," he said. "If you're in the \$30-50,000 bracket, you get to buy the Cadillac."

Reagan defends his staff's integrity

WASHINGTON — President Reagan accused Democratic critics of his administration's ethics Wednesday night of violating the American tradition that people are presumed innocent until proven guilty.

Reagan, speaking at a televised news conference, was referring to Democratic attacks on administration integrity, including criticism of his nomination of Edwin Meese III as attorney general. Meese's nomination is stalled in the Senate while a special prosecutor investigates allegations involving his personal finances.

"We're having an awful lot of guilt by accusation. I'm not going to take any action that is based on accusations without proof," he said without mentioning Meese specifically.

Democrats, hoping to capitalize on the issue, have started using a television commercial emphasizing ethical questions raised against Reagan appointees.

On another issue, Reagan said Congress "must take a responsibility" for a

loss of credibility in the Middle East. Of the debate on U.S. policy in Lebanon, he said, "All this can do is stimulate the terrorists and urge them on."

Campaigns move to Penn.

The three Democratic presidential hopefuls turned their attention to Pennsylvania, the next state to hold a primary with large numbers of delegates at stake.

The Rev. Jesse Jackson led the campaigning with an afternoon speech that attacked Hart and Mondale for favoring increases in the defense budget. "We must learn the lessons of Vietnam," he said. "We cannot have guns and butter."

In Tuesday's New York primary, former Vice President Walter Mondale won 133 delegates, Colorado Sen. Gary Hart picked up 72 and Jackson received 47.

Ingram denies wrongdoing

RALEIGH — State insurance commissioner and gubernatorial candidate John Ingram acknowledged Wednesday that he sought campaign contributions from executives of companies that he regulates, but said he did not initiate the contacts.

The *Charlotte Observer* reported Wednesday that Ingram personally called several out-of-state insurance executives at their homes or offices seeking help in raising campaign money. A follow-up letter from the Ingram campaign suggested to the executives that they buy fund-raiser tickets with a single check and that the resulting contribution should be noted as being \$100 or less.

In a Wednesday news conference, Ingram said he merely responded to indications by insurance companies that they wanted to help his campaign. "If someone wants to help our campaign, they help," Ingram said.
