Area hiring outlook lower than U.S. average

Raleigh employers report hiring expectations below the national average for the second quarter of 1984, according to a survey of businesses nationwide, while other North Carolina cities have more optimistic job outlooks.

The survey, the Manpower, Inc. Employment Outlook Survey, for the second guarter of 1984, polled more than 11,000 U.S. firms to determine hiring expectations.

"Nationally, 30 percent of all employers polled plan to increase staff and only five plan to decrease," said Manpower public relations writer Jerry Slaske.

But in the Raleigh area, 26 percent of the employers surveyed reported increased hiring expectations, while 10 percent plan to reduce their staffs. Last year, Manpower Inc. reported that 35 percent of Raleigh employers planned to hire more workers, while none planned to cut back. By the final quarter of 1983, 32 percent planned further hiring and 6 percent expected store studions

In Durham, the number of employers expecting to hire more workers is increasing, although it has not reached the national average of 30 percent.

"For Durham the percentages are far better than a few years ago," Slaske said. "In the second quarter of 1983, only 14 percent of employers polled reported hiring potentials.

"This year the figures have changed considerably, with 27 percent of Durham employers expecting an increase, 3 percent expecting a decrease, 67 percent expecting no change and 3 percent unsure," Slaske said.

Economic growth in Durham will come from a broad base of industries, Slaske said.

"Those industries include services sector, wholesale and resale trade, education, both public and private, public administration, manufacturing of both durable and nondurable goods and transportation and public utilities."

The Manpower survey also reported that hiring expectations in Greensboro are well above the national average

"In Greensboro, 48 percent of those employers surveyed expect an increase, 7 percent expect a decrease, and 45 percent said they expect no change," Slaske said.

"Those job opportunities are transportation, public utilities, finance, insurance and real estate, and the services sector," said Slaske.

Although the outlook for job opportunities from existing employers in the Raleigh area may not be as optimistic as in some areas, many new jobs are being created by new businesses opening there.

"In 1983, 11 new companies opened in the Wake County area with an increase in employment of 1,045," said Amy Walden Smith, a spokesman for the Raleigh Chamber of Commerce.

"Only two years ago in 1981, those figures were seven new companies and 371 new employees," Smith said. "While the number of new companies increased only 36 percent, the number of new employees increased more than 50 percent," she said.

Candidate for secretary of state faces uphill battle

Wake County Commissioner Betty Ann Knudsen faces a formidable task in the upcoming N.C. primary. She is trying to unseat 12-term incumbent Secretary of State Thad Eure on May 8.

Knudsen is running for office with promises of moving the secretary's office to the Legislative Building, modernizing the methods of record keeping and making those records available to the public.

A Wake County commissioner since 1976, Knudsen announced her candidacy for secretary of state last October. But for someone trying to defeat a man established in office since 1936, Knudsen keeps herself busy with a lot of things other than her own campaign.

"I swim 36 laps in the pool per day and work approximately 30 hours per week on the gubernatorial campaign of Democrat Tom Gilmore as well as 30 hours on my own campaign," Knudsen said. "I get up between five and six in the morning. I have

a high energy level and am well organized."

Knudsen announced the curtailment of her own campaign to work for Gilmore in February.

In spite of spending a lot of time on Gilmore's campaign, Knudsen said "there's a good chance I'll be victorious. If everybody who knows me plus the people who believe that it's time for change vote for me, then there's a good chance I'll win."

Campaign spokesperson Marlyn Miller

said she is also optimistic about Knudsen's chances of winning.

Miller said Knudsen's campaign received and spent \$24,500 in 1983 and guessed it had received \$8,000 to \$10,000 so far this year, including in-kind donations. She said they received \$15,500 inkind" last year. "These people didn't donate money, but what they did translated into that amount. A lot of that was for a computer we utilized in the campaign."

Food costs drop in March

WASHINGTON - Food costs dropped 0.1 percent in March, holding the increase in consumer prices last month to a small 0.2 percent, the Labor Department reported Tuesday.

The decrease was the first since last July. It leaves the cost inflation rate at a moderate 5 percent for the year.

Marlin Fitzwater, a spokesman for the White House, welcomed the report as "very reassuring news." Some economists had said that the 8.3 percent growth in the economy in the first quarter of this year could force an increase in prices and wages.
