## Student Legal Services director serves about 2,000 students yearly

Dottie Bernholz, director of Student Legal Services, graduated from UNC in 1963 and "never moved away." Bernholz legally represents all UNC students.

Student Legal Services at UNC serves 2,000 students a year; Bernholz, a General College adviser, has individual contact with a large number of students.



**Dottie Bernholz** she deals mostly with "students' landlord/tenant difficulties, and, unfortunately, divorces."

Legal services does not differentiate problems by gender, but Bernholz said, "along sexual lines, I see more distressed unwed fathers (than unwed mothers). He's had no guidance and comes in very naive."

Bernholz said N.C. laws that discriminate against women are rare. "There's been a great deal of reform. Most (now) place a heavier burden on men. Marital property is now divided in half; there have been significant changes."

"I do psychologically favor ERA," Bernholz said. She feels ERA is needed but the problem would be

"enforcement," she said. Bernholz feels Legal Services "has fulfilled a big need, but students are still asserting their rights without understanding their responsibilities."

Bernholz said the biggest problem, is that "students come through (college) in isolated circumstance." She said students are too protected, often living together and joining fraternities and sororities.

"People living alone have a clearer vision of reality. I think UNC should let student still living in an embryonic world see that's a real world out there. I'm not sure that's happening," she said.

Bernholz said she believes women have to overcome the "new superwoman, superlawyer, be-everything image." She said, "It's tough. Women have to recognize their weaknesses."

Bernholz lives close to campus with her husband, also an attorney, and a 16-year-old son who goes to Chapel Hill High School. They have a 20-year-old daughter who attends Boston University.

At home, Bernholz said she is constantly reminded that she is "as human as anyone else. I scream and yell too. I might be a role model on campus, but at home everyone's on my case. It's self-regulating," she said.

As a professional Bernholz said she feels "you've got to have self-respect, be a little tougher. Being competitive and not complacent is good for you." But she balances it by not taking herself too seriously. "Sometimes you just have to laugh at yourself," she said.

Dear Customers:

During the reconnection of student telephone service in August of 1983 there was considerable confusion and misunderstanding regarding the provision of Custom Calling features which resulted in some students receiving unrequested Custom Calling features. On behalf of Southern Bell I want to apologize again for any inconvenience, confusion, or misunderstanding.

In order to avoid any similar occurrences in the future, we will implement new procedures for service connections beginning with the 1984 fall semester.

As in the past, dormitory students will still be able to fill out an application form for telephone service. We believe this method is a time-saver and convenience to you and to the Company. However, this form will be changed to avoid future problems.

(1) It will include a listing of the various Custom Calling Services available with a method for selecting those which you may desire.

(2) It will show an itemization of the charges for these services as well as charges for service connection, basic services and additional directory listings.

(3) To avoid misunderstandings regarding proper authorization of the services requested, the application will require the signature of the customer responsible for the service and will be carbonized so that you may retain a copy of the application for your records.

(4) Any subsequent marketing by telephone of Custom Calling features to the students will be followed by a confirmation letter to them which will itemize the services ordered, the charges for those services and the date of the order.
