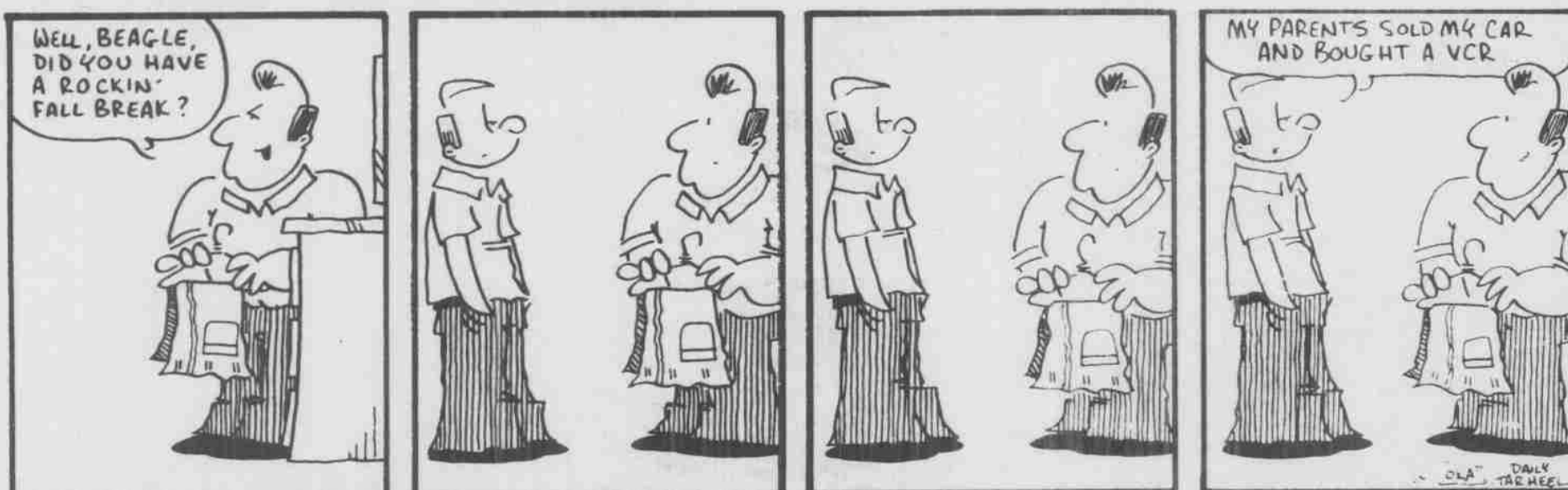

"I'll also add that if we don't protect, preserve and maintain our moral and spiritual priorities — and I'll put that one first — we won't be able to solve any of our other problems," he said. "I believe this nation was born in God's name and in his grace."

Helms said Reagan had rebuilt U.S. defenses weakened by Democratic President Jimmy Carter, praising the U.S. military victory in Grenada and taking potshots at the media.

"Sam Donaldson and the liberal media complained that the press wasn't told about the invasion... I say the next time we've got to invade and shoot someone, let's send the media in first,"

he said.

Helms also spoke of his September 1983 trip to Korea where he was originally scheduled to fly KAL flight 007 but rescheduled his flight at the last minute to attend a Texas fundraiser with Tom Landry, Dallas Cowboys coach. His flight and KAL 007 refueled in Anchorage, Alaska, at the same time. He recalled playing with two small children and how he was the last person to see them board the airline that was shot down by the Soviets. After reading a letter sent to him from the grandparents of the children, he told the crowd "No, Samantha, (the Soviets) are not just like us."
