**Bragging rights at stake as UNC, N.C. State battle**

**Braggin' rights.**  
In some of this nation's biggest, more intense rivalries—Oklahoma vs. Texas, USC vs. UCLA, Michigan vs. Ohio State—there is usually much more at stake than the right to boast of a victory for some 12 months. Major bowls, national championships, etc. It all adds in.

That will not even begin to figure into tomorrow's clash in Kenan Stadium between North Carolina and N.C. State.

The Tar Heels, at 1-4, are off to their worst start in 16 years and won't receive any honors (ACC title, bowl bid) unless they win their next six games. Meanwhile, the Wolfpack at 3-3 is something of an enigma. State surprised nationally-ranked Georgia Tech, but

lost to Division I-AA Furman, and struggled to beat lowly East Carolina (1-6).

The Tar Heels have won five straight in this series, but the Tar Heels were always a decidedly better football team. This year, neither squad has shown a marked improvement over the previous seasons, and this one is, literally, up for grabs.

Nonetheless, don't think it's any less important to the participants. UNC inside linebacker Micah Moon is definitely looking forward to a clean four-year sweep of the Wolfpack.

"This is definitely a big game," Moon said. "This rivalry means a lot to us and to them."

Moon, who was moved back inside to his old position before last week's loss to Wake Forest, should be more of a threat to N.C. State quarterback

Tim Esposito and tailback Joe McIntosh than he would have been in earlier weeks, when he struggled as an outside linebacker.

"I was like a freshman out there," Moon said of the change. Moon did not play in spring practice because of an injury, but was moved to the outside because there was no experience at that position.

"We didn't have anybody out there at first, but we're better off there now," said UNC coach Dick Crum. Moon switched positions with linebacker Carl Carr. Moon will team with Troy Simmons at the inside slots, while Carr will join freshman standout Noel McEachern in patrolling the outer perimeters.

Moon said the key for the improving UNC defense will rest with how well the unit can stop McIntosh.

"It's going to be tough to contain them," Moon said of McIntosh and

fullback Vince Evans. "But we've come together as a group and we're improving each week."

N.C. State head coach Tom Reed said the team's records never really matter when these two teams play. "The game is always a battle," he said. "Going to play them on their home field will certainly be one of the biggest challenges our kids will face this year, and I'm sure they'll play hard."

Crum said this game is unique in that at least one of the teams always seems to have a good record and some national standing. "But a win this time doesn't mean a great season for either team," Crum said.

Both teams are coming off of difficult losses. The Tar Heels struggled on offense and fell to Wake Forest, 14-3, while State gave up 23 points in the second quarter and was blasted by Maryland, 44-21.
