skill and position, the character of the athlete was also important. "You've got to find out about what kind of person you're talking to."

Redshirt freshman quarterback Mark Maye said the academic possibilities appealed to him when looking over the dozens of schools who recruited him in 1983. "I got the approach where they just let the school sell itself," Maye said. "It has a good academic reputation and good athletics. They never tried to force me into any kind of decision at any time."

Sophomore point guard Kenny Smith said UNC appealed to him because coach Smith had a track record of his players graduating, and at the same time they were honest with him. "They told me the opportunity to play was there, but they could not guarantee me any playing time, which they do with all the recruits."

Both Himebauch and coach Smith said the current trend in recruiting — one made out of necessity — is to concentrate primarily on regional athletes.

"More and more people are choosing not to spread themselves thin, and just zoom in on certain players," said Smith, adding that his staff usually doesn't go out of the ACC region of the country unless an athlete has shown a particular interest in the school.

"Every year we narrow it down quickly (the number of prospects)," Smith said. "If we don't think we have a good chance to get somebody we don't

spend a lot of time on them."

Smith said the prospects are evaluated on these criteria: academic standing, ability to fit in to the UNC game, size, ability to catch the ball. "If you have (size and) can catch the ball, we'll recruit you."

Because of travel costs and the large number of athletes recruited, the football program also limits itself to some degree, Himebauch said. "To do an adequate job, you need to recruit 95 percent within a 500-mile radius," he said.

In the meantime, some universities

"One problem with recruiting is society," Smith said. "I don't know if you can ever change it. Maybe you can make the penalties more stringent."

Commissioner James said he had not heard of any recruiting problems in the area, but that it didn't mean the problem would diminish nationwide. "The recent problems are getting better," he said. "But the intensity of recruiting is not declining."
