Education

majored in education did so because they had a genuine interest in teaching and working with young people.

Students also said majoring in education was a way to work within their interests.

Marshall George, a junior education major from Mehane said he had always liked English, and majoring in education while specializing in English was a good way to do something with English.

Students majoring in education also have options besides school-room teaching, such as being counselors, school pyschologists or superintendents

UNC is one of few research universities with an undergraduate education program. Brown said one reason UNC still had an undergraduate program was its commitment to providing North Carolina's public schools with good. academically strong teachers.

Palmer said the state legislature almost insisted that UNC maintain an undergraduate program because UNC represented the major school of the 16school UNC system.

Faculty dedication

Both students and faculty agreed that the faculty was one of the strongest points of the School of Education.

"The administration is very cooperative and will help you find things," said Sonya Ryden, a senior education major from Wilmington. "The teachers are like friends, and they will help you with problems."

Denise Suggs, a junior education major from Snow Hill, said, "They like for you to have a close relationship, and they will help you if you need it."

Phillip Reavis, a junior education major from Troutman, said the department was up-to-date and always was working on ways to improve.

One example is the Education 54 lab which now gives students the chance to participate in learning media skills rather than going into a classroom and observing media skills as was done in the past, Reavis said. The lab is like an independent study giving the student

a chance to work on projects such as opaque projections, design hand-outs, lamination and slide shows, he said,

Faculty members also said they were involved in improving the quality of education both inside and outside the University.

Palmer said the school was always changing to make its professors better teachers and to make its graduates the best possible teachers.

"It's management strategy understanding learning styles and theories, manipulation of materials and how to maximize best use of time," he said. "It's a science. We're constantly looking for fine-tuning, implementing, management, good learning and good teachers."

Barbara D. Day, professor and chairwoman of curriculum and instruction in the School of Education, said: "We pride ourselves on teaching. We have a strong commitment to serving higher education and new knowledge.

"We are preparing leaders for the schools of North Carolina, the nation and the world," she said.

Faculty diverstiy

The school also has a diverse faculty that teaches, writes and researches. Day said.

Burke agreed. "The research productivity is very good for a faculty this size." he said.

During the past decade, faculty research has increased in the number of publications nationally cited, he said. Faculty members also are involved

with several other educational activities. Upward Bound, a program administered by the School of Education and funded in part through a federal grant from the Department of Education, seeks to aid disadvantaged high school students by helping them prepare for college.

The Mathematics and Science Education Center also has been established at the University as a part of a network of centers to be located on various campuses in the UNC system, with the purpose of promoting quality mathematics and science instruction in North Carolina's public schools.

The faculty in the School of Education also reorganized the department to improve teacher education.

Instead of having four departmental divisions, the School of Education has divided into two divisions: the Division of Teaching and Learning, and the Division of Supportive Services and Administration.

Palmer said the school reorganized to improve its internal education.

Burke said the new organizational structure had great potential that had not yet been recognized fully. The School is in the process of realizing all the problems and potentials of this plan. he said.

Faculty members also said that receiving enough funding was sometimes another difficulty in the School of Education.

"We're a good school and we have potential for being better, but we are still fighting for additional resources." Brown said.
