to sign it. "There was definitely coercion," he said.

UNC diving coach Barry Thomas, one of Comfort's two full-time assistants, said the swimmers should have solved the problem "in-house." Thomas said: "One of the weaknesses with their argument is they obviously wanted to avoid a confrontation with Frank. Rather than looking at themselves the source of the problem — they're pointing to Frank.

"The ones that signed it were the ones that were more lax (in workouts). The ones that didn't sign it were more successful."

O'Brien agreed. "You only get out what you put in," she said. "People are looking at Frank when it's their own problem."

The petition also read in part: "High

All team members interviewed said that if Comfort did not resign, they would still swim for the team next year. "I don't think anyone wants to give up," said a freshman swimmer who did not wish to be identified. "But we will keep fighting until something comes out of this."






