Mall gets 'Gift Tree'

A smiling crowd of about 50 took a break from their Christmas shopping Friday to watch head basketball coach Dean Smith's wife and daughters light the first "Gift Tree" of the Chapel Hill Service League's Christmas House at University Mall.

Dr. Linnea Smith, along with Kelly, 7, and Kristen, 5, plugged in the cord that illuminated the 6-foot tree, which the Service League will use as a means to collect toys for needy children in Chapel Hill who may not have had any otherwise.

The Service League sponsored a special program earlier Friday to present its first Christmas House Gift Tree, which included performances by the UNC Loreleis and Pro Cantare. Ron Stutts of WCHL radio hosted the event.

Shoppers wandered past, pausing to listen to the music, while their children enjoyed the sights and sounds of Christmas.

The tree was decorated with ornaments hand-made by members of the league. Each ornament has the age and sex of a child who will be served by the league in its annual Christmas House program.

Shoppers are asked to choose an ornament from the tree and return a gift for the child listed next to a large red box by the tree.

The league will distribute the gifts on Dec. 8. This year, 500 children will receive the toys, although the Inter-Faith Council submitted more names than that, according to program organizer Charlotte

"We look forward to the community's response to the tree and hope this will be the first of many gift trees," Margolis said.

The Service League has distributed toys to needy children for years, but this is the first time they have had a tree, she said.

The action repeats a similar The group plans to build the support group protest in March opposing the University's \$7.2 million investments in businesses operating in South Africa. The 20-day protest ended when police held but did not charge — five support group members while Physical Plant

workers dismantled the shanties. Despite the counts of last spring, the group did not and will not seek a permit to build the shanty, Arnold


said. The group's members do not want to be arrested or suspended from school, but they think they have a right to protest UNC's holdings, Arnold said.


The group also plans to march Thursday from the Old Well to the Endowment Board's meeting at the Carolina Inn, she said.

Thursday's Endowment Board meeting follows an Oct. 17 meeting of the Board of Trustees, whose members make up the Endowment Board. At that meeting the trustees tabled a Student Congress resolution sponsored by the support group that asked the trustees to encourage the Endowment Board to divest.


