In the absolute shocker of the weekend, the defending national champion Louisville Cardinals got off to a less than rousing start by dropping their first three games of the season in the Great Alaska Shootout

Louisville lost to Northeastern Friday night 88-84, as Huskie sensation Reggie Lewis poured in 32 points and angered Dick Vitale with his poor shot selection in the second half. Saturday, Washington dropped the No. 2 Cardinals 69-54, and Sunday Texas hit Louisville while it was down, knocking off the Cards 74-70 in the seventh-place game.

"If I was really concerned about winning, we'd be playing at home," Crum said after the Washington setback. "But I want the kids to learn and that's why you come to a tournament like this."

In the Shootout semifinals Saturday, Iowa squeaked by N.C. State 90-89 in overtime, and Northeastern defeated Utah St. 96-91. Elsewhere:

No. 5 UNLV pulled another one out of the hat, defeating Western Kentucky 96-95 in double overtime to capture the preseason NIT. The Running Rebels, who beat Temple

Friday night on a last-second shot, trailed by as many as 21 points during the first half and by 16 at intermission.

The Rebs rallied with the help of the three-point shot, as guard Freddie Banks caught fire and began to gun and hit from all over the floor. Banks finished the game with 31 points, and five three-point goals, including the bomb with 13 seconds left in the game which won it for UNLV. Tellis Frank finished with 23 for the Hilltoppers.

Richmond dropped No. 6 Georgia Tech 67-62 in overtime, as reserve Scott Stapleton hit a jump shot with 2:53 left to put the Spiders ahead for good. Duane Ferrell had 20 points to lead the Yellow Jackets.

Navy and Michigan State also went to overtime, where Midshipman David Robinson hit the winning basket with four seconds left to give No. 9 Navy the 91-90 victory. Robinson finished with an incredible 43 points on the day.

Ken "The Snake" Norman scored 22 points and Glynn Blackwell added 17 as No. 14 Illinois cruised past Duke 69-62. Tommy Amaker had 16 points to pace the Blue Devils.

The win may have been a pyrrhic one for the No. 3 Hoosiers, though, as Ricky Calloway went down with a knee injury and may be lost for the year.

No. 15 Syracuse romped by Loyola (Ill.) 87-66, as senior guard Greg Monroe scored 14 points and 6-9 freshman Derrick Coleman, preseason Big East Rookie of the Year, had 13 points and four blocks.

Finally, talent-rich Pittsburgh crushed Indiana (Pa.) 108-49 as bombing guard Curtis Aiken scored a career-high 27 points on 11-of-19 shooting. Silky-smooth center Charles Smith contributed 22 points and 11 rebounds for the No. 16 Panthers.

Iwo coaches leave posts

For two college football coaches, it's time to find a new job. One coach decided that on his own, while the other was rather indelicately pushed out of his present position.

Texas head man Fred Akers was the one who was pushed. Akers, who had become the target of mounting criticism as the Longhorns stumbled through their first losing season in three decades, was fired Saturday. His fate was probably sealed last Thursday night when Texas was defeated by arch-rival Texas A&M.

Athletic director DeLoss Dodds said Akers would be reassigned to other duties at the university, but that those duties had not yet been determined. Akers presumably will not take over Dodds' position, nor will he become president of the

Akers finished his career in Austin with an 86-31-2 record and two SWC titles, in 1977 and 1983

At LSU, head coach Bill Arnsparger made the choice to leave on his own. He announced his decision in the lockerroom after the Tigers had rolled over Tulane 37-7 and earned the right to play in the Sugar Bowl. Arnsparger, former defensive coordinator for the Miami Dolphins, said he will continue coaching the team through the bowl game.

There has been speculation that Arnsparger may take the post of athletic director at Florida.


