## 'Radio Days' tunes into the past

"Radio Days" is a very well-done comical film set in the World War II era against the backdrop of radio. Written and directed by Woody Allen, the movie combines good acting, an interesting storyline, and amusing characters to charm the audience.

Allen telling of his childhood experiences which were dominated by radio. He uses Seth Green to portray Joe, the narrator as a young boy,

and most of the movie is seen through his eyes. This, along with the big band tunes that play continually in the background, moves the audience back to the time when radio was king.

The movie drags at times, but these slow periods are brief and are more than made up for by the hilarious stories which are enacted throughout the movie.

"Radio Days" is basically the story of the everyday lives of Joe's family. However, the characters, more so than the actions, make the film intriguing. Examples of these characters are the constantly bickering parents and the cousin who listens in on the neighbor's party line. Each of the characters has his own favorite radio show which helps him escape the doldrums of his life.

The most amusing parts in the film are the episodes which take everyday situations and make them entertaining. For example, there is the time when a classmate of Joe's brings a condom to school for "Show and Tell." In another scene, Joe's aunt is sitting in the kitchen with her date when he tells her that he was engaged to a man. Like these, most of the other episodes are extremely amusing and greatly add to the film.

"Radio Days" is a refreshing movie that cleverly portrays how radio had an immense effect on the lives of ordinary people. It combines great acting and good directing with a well-written screenplay to form an entertaining film that is definitely a winner.
