UNC golf 8th at NCAA's; Alumni basketball set

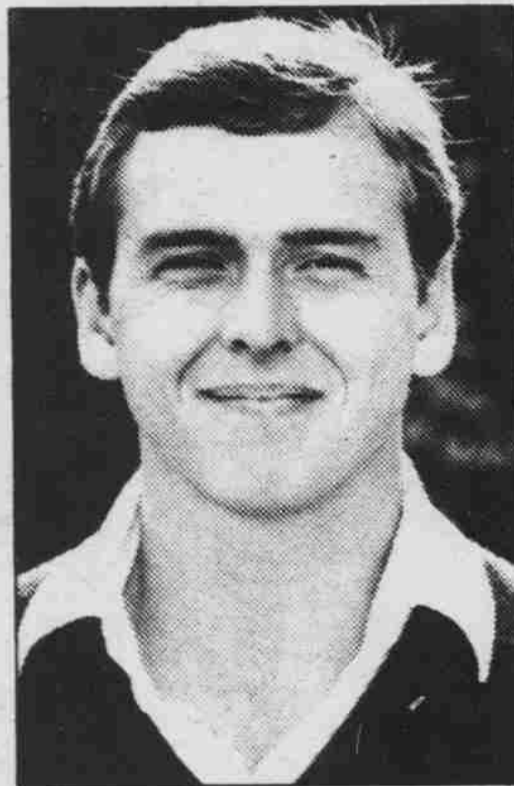
Paced by strong final-round performances by Greg Parker (68) and John Hughes (72), North Carolina on Saturday finished eighth in the 90th NCAA men's golf championships in Columbus, Ohio.

The Tar Heels' four-day total of 42-over-par 1194 on Ohio State University's par-72 Scarlet Course accounted for the best UNC finish in NCAA play since a fourth-place showing in 1984.

Parker, posting rounds of 73, 75, 73 and 68, finished 1-over-par 289 to notch fifth place.

Perennial power Oklahoma State, last year's runner-up, posted an 8-over total of 1160 to claim the team title. Individual medalist Brian Watts shot a final-round 66 to assure the Cowboys of their 13th top two finish in the past 15 years.

UNC senior John Hughes went 74, 76, 73 and 73 for a 7-over total of 295, placing 20th, individually. Other Tar Heels were Jim Sowerwine (21-over 309), Peter Brennan (21-over 309) and Gene Holland (23-over 311).

The only time Dean Smith and John Wooden matched coaching wits, in the 1968 NCAA championship game, the Wizard of Westwood and his UCLA Bruins came out on top, 78-55.

On June 28, thanks to power of television, Smith will get

another shot at Wooden, albeit in a less intense situation.

Alumni from North Carolina and UCLA will face off on the Bruins' home floor, Pauley Pavilion, in a game nationally-televised by ABC. The event will honor Wooden, who retired in 1975 after winning 10 national championships in 11 seasons.

Among the UNC players committed to play are NBA scoring champion Michael Jordan, L.A. Lakers forward James Worthy, Phil Ford, Kenny Smith, Joe Wolf, Brad Daugherty, Sam Perkins, Matt Doherty, Dudley Bradley, Lennie Rosenbluth, Mike Pepper, Tommy Kearns, Rusty Clark, Dick Grubar, Bill Bunting, Charlie Scott, Mitch Kupchak, Tommy LaGarde, Rich Yonaker and Steve Previs.

The Bruins roster will include current UCLA coach Walt Hazzard, Marques Johnson, Kiki Vandeweghe, Michael Warren, Gail Goodrich, Montle Hatcher and Rod Foster. Bill Walton and Kareem Abdul-Jabbar, who recently faced off in the NBA finals, will play in the game if able to work around prior scheduling

commitments.

"We had been trying to come up with a concept like this and had been talking to coach Smith about it," said Mike Burg, executive producer of Jefferson-Pilot telecommunications. "UCLA had

also been talking to coach Wooden about a similar thing.

"We decided to take the concepts and put them together to celebrate two of the finest college basketball programs in the country."

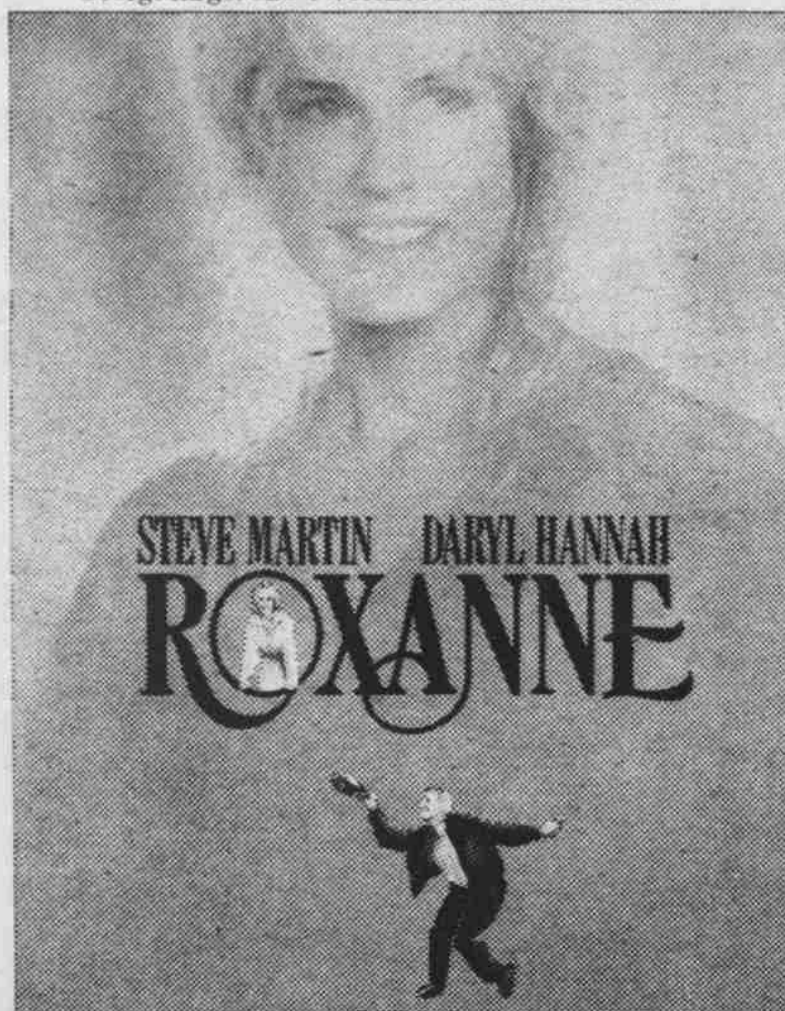
