On Saturday, Minnesota's Mary Kuhlman tied a course record when she shot a sizzling 68. Wake Forest's Kiernan Prechtl fired a hole-in-one on Sunday on the par-3, 172-yard second hole.

UNC's highest finisher was Donna Andrews, who finished tied for ninth with a 229 mark after an even-par 73 on Sunday.

The tournament marks the end of the fall season for the Tar Heels.
