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being comparative, Powell said. "What we would like to see happen is that we would like a standardized process."

Provost Dennis O'Connor said he supported the idea of faculty evaluations but was concerned about the generalizing process proposed in the model.

"At a personal level, I find the use of standardized instruments a difficult phenomenon to understand in this kind of review. I think the strength of the University is in its absolute heterogeneity."

"There are some units in which there is extensive faculty input, and it tends to be rather uniquely fitted to the unit being reviewed. It may be that there would be a need for it (a new evaluation procedure) in areas where it (faculty involvement) doesn't exist."

Powell said that after a normalized list of evaluation points was established, separate departments could individualize their own evaluations.

O'Connor said the administration would be interested in helping to develop a final system. "As an administrator who would undoubtedly be reviewed by this process, I would hope the committee would be willing to meet with some of us (administrators) to develop a process where faculty involvement would not be burdensome and would be effective. I think Chancellor Hardin is all in favor of faculty involvement in the review process."

Faculty members at the meeting were generally in favor of the proposal, but expressed concerns about time-consuming paperwork and the effectiveness of reviews.

"This is a superb report," said Donald Warren, Kenan professor in the School of Dentistry. "I think there's a built-in bias in the existing system. These reviews tend to be cursory. When faculty feel that there's nobody up the line that listens to them, they then become a group of people who show behavior that is inappropriate for a group of faculty."

"I think the University will be better for it (a new review process). This is an important document, and we need to read it twice or even more."

Paul Farel, professor of physiology, said the extra work for faculty members may be a drawback. "It puts tremendous administrative work on the faculty. Many of us would resent the time away from research and teaching."

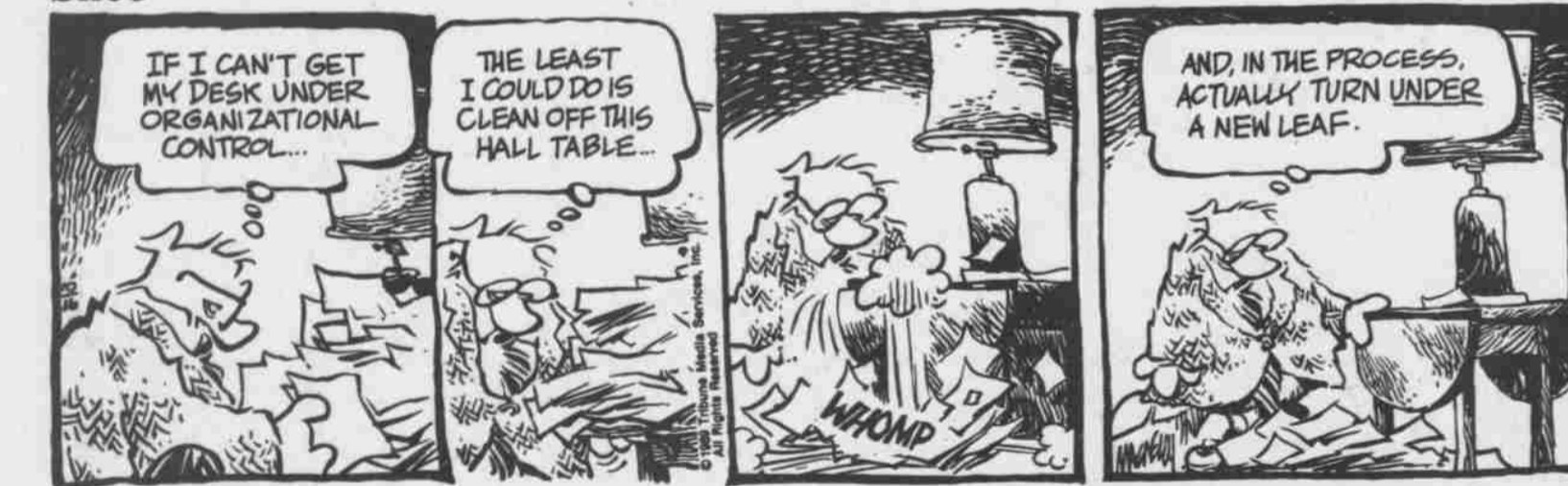

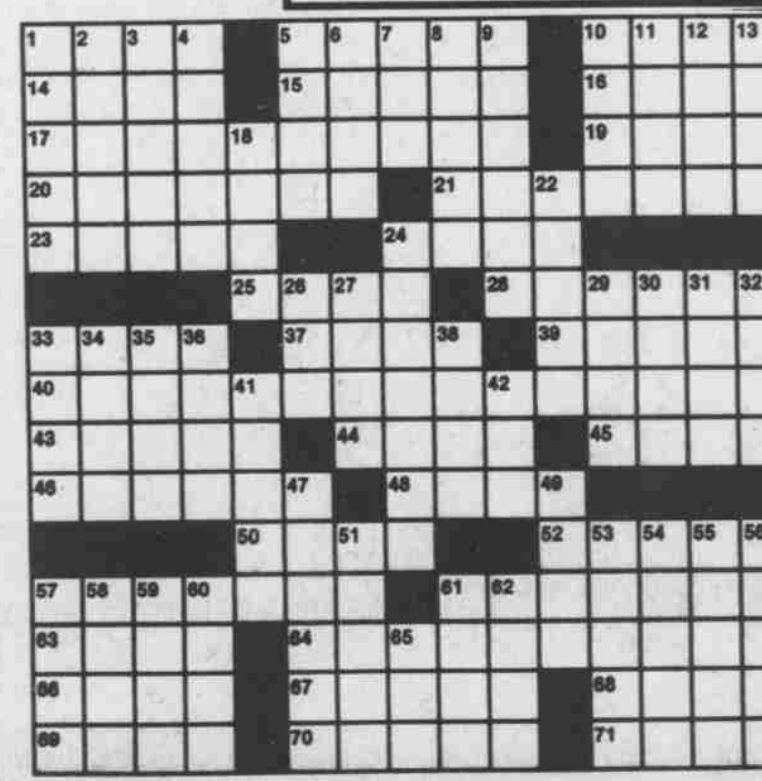
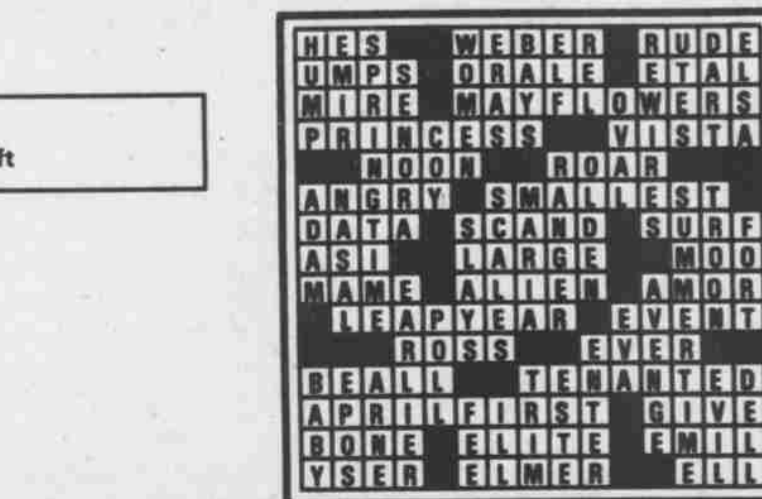
