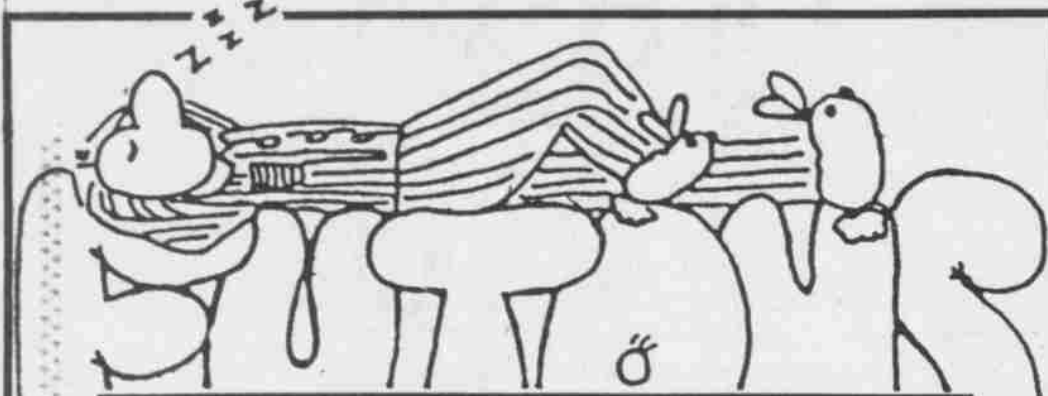

BOT members would let politics influence their decisions.

"I think most of them (BOT members) take their position too seriously to let (politics) enter into their decisions."

Instead, the BOT may have feared that Burnstudio would be unable to design a building compatible with other buildings on the campus, Burns said. "It seems to me that our office may not

have been well known. Because we have done avant-garde work before, they may not have been sure we could handle a project in the traditional area of campus."

The committee is confident that Burns will design the building students want, Frye said. "We're really excited about working with her. She has demonstrated an undeniable ability to be flexible."

political reaction in the Congress of the United States that we see causing some very unwise decisions about offshore oil and gas drilling," Martin said.

He said prohibition of offshore drilling increased the likelihood for oil spills because more tankers would have to be used to meet U.S. oil needs. According to Martin, less than 0.05 percent of the oil spilled into the earth's oceans has come from offshore oil production, whereas 47 percent has come from transport-related accidents.

"Mobil has an excellent record for safety operations around the world. In particular, in the Gulf of Mexico Mobil has twice received from the government the annual Safe Award."

Mobil is the only company to have won the award for environmental safety

more than once, Martin said.

"I believe that is an indication of the kind of serious intention Mobil places on safety of operations and on our environmental covenant, which is taken very seriously by the corporate officers, every operating manager and everyone that works for Mobil."

Kurz said, "It would not make a difference what company is doing the drilling because they all have the same technology."

In addition to oil spills, oil rigs produce high amounts of pollution daily. Kurz said the dirt and sludge displaced by the drilling contained chemical and radioactive material. Marine organisms absorb this material and smother, she said.

Kuncl said some of the other residence halls on Olde Campus had had temporary problems with heating, "but the major problems have been in Everett."

Kuncl said the housing department had temporarily supplied space heaters to certain residents who had no heat.

Lynn Smith, a resident assistant in Everett, said at least six residents on her floor had space heaters.

"Overall, they (her residents) have been very cooperative. They understand that the University is working to correct the problem."

Jim Weaver, area director of Olde Campus, said the problems with heat in Grimes, Ruffin and Manly were very

minimal, but Mangum might represent a problem.

"I hope it will be fixed for the students while they are home over Christmas break."

"I feel we've done a very good job with responding to calls from the students, especially with the significance of the problem."

Si Yon Yu, a resident assistant in Manly, said she had had some problems with her heating system.

"The temperature has not been consistent, and I've called in to report this at least three times."

According to Yu, the heating is activated by a drop in temperature inside or outside the residence hall.

In addition to these and other reforms, the committee recommended the University work for reforms on a national level, even though the reforms would make it difficult for UNC's athletic teams to compete with other Division I-A teams.

But even if the NCAA has not adopted these reforms after five years, the University should consider adopting them, the committee said.

A minority of the committee said the University should adopt these reforms after five years, and not just consider adopting them. Another minority said the University should adopt these reforms now.

These national reforms include:

- The length of any sports season should not exceed the length of the average semester, and student-athletes should spend less than 30 hours per week during a team's season for all team activities, including practice,

games, team conditioning, chalk talks and travel. Student-athletes, during the off-season while classes are in session, should not spend more than 14 hours per week on conditioning and other team activities.

- Freshmen should be ineligible for varsity play, and "red-shirting" for the sole purpose of extending a student-athlete's playing years should be abolished, limiting a player's college career to three years.

- Universities should not admit any athlete whose academic qualifications fall below the least qualified non-athlete admitted in the same admission category.

If these reforms are not enacted, the committee suggested withdrawing from intercollegiate athletic competition.

"We regard withdrawal from intercollegiate athletics as a serious alternative to the present state of things, which is intolerable."
