In other summer legislative news: Orange County will benefit from the General Assembly's decision to raise the hotel occupancy tax by one percent. Moses Carey, Jr., chairman of the Orange County Commissioners, said the money would go to finance the Orange County Visitors Services Bureau.

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Institutions like the School of Science and Math are effective in preparing students for careers in the sciences, but society needs schools specializing in the humanities, group members said.

Judith Rhodes, a Chapel Hill Phillips Middle School teacher, said, "There's nothing out there to reward students who won't be inventing rockets but who have other gifts in the humanities."
