Bills paid despite treasurer's absence

Student groups have not been seriously disrupted, although many of them experienced funding problems this summer after a restraining order was issued against the acting student body treasurer, the director of the Student Activities Fund Office said Wednesday.

Some payments to businesses were delayed. The most notable delayed bill was to Village Printing, which prints The Phoenix, said SAFO Director Howard Brubaker.

"I've spoken to Village Printing and they are going to get paid today or tomorrow," Brubaker said. "They

seemed pretty satisfied. I have had no real problems with anyone that I talked to being upset at the delay in payment."

Susan Crisp, operations manager for Village Printing, said the company probably would continue to accept The Phoenix's business because the paper was affiliated with the University.

"It is very unlikely that we will not do business with them," she said.

Charles Overbeck, Phoenix editor, said Village Printing had agreed to continue printing the publication. "They are going to print us, and they will get their check tomorrow."

Mark Bibbs, chief justice of the Student Supreme Court, issued a restraining order in June against Kristina Sung,

who had been appointed acting student body treasurer for the summer by Student Body President Matt Heyd.

Student Body Treasurer Josh Siegel was in New York during the summer.

Rep. Eric Pratt, Dist. 22, had challenged Sung's appointment by filing a suit charging that Heyd violated the student government code by failing to win congressional approval before appointing Sung. The suit was dismissed after Sung resigned and Heyd pleaded no contest to the allegation.

Brubaker said student-funded groups that did not have a treasurer in Chapel Hill this summer also were affected by the restraining order.

"In as many cases as possible, we mailed requisitions for checks to Josh for his approval," Brubaker said.

The student body treasurer must approve all fee appropriations and authorize payments on SAFO accounts.

Anti-abortion leaders fined, jailed

WICHITA, Kan. — A federal judge jailed three abortion protest leaders Wednesday and fined each \$10,000 after repeated violations of his order to quit blocking access to clinics.

U.S. District Judge Patrick Kelly also levied a \$10,000 fine against the anti-abortion group, Operation Rescue.

The three leaders and the group also

will be fined \$500 a day for the next 10 days, or until they swear to obey the judge's order. All three had been before Kelly previously for contempt of court hearings and were released after promising to obey Kelly's order.

"They have no respect for civil authority whether it is this court or the president of the United States," Kelly said.
