Track records fall; Magic wins All-Star MVP

Staff and wire reports
Allen Johnson broke a UNC record and nabbed an NCAA Championship berth with a 55-meter high hurdles time of 7.23 seconds Saturday at the Carolina Classic Track and Field Meet.

Tar Heel pole vaulter Kevin Brown also set a UNC record, as he sprung 17 feet, 8-1/2 inches Friday to break his own mark for the third straight week. Brown and UNC's Rob Rothwell, who finished second behind Brown, provisionally qualified for the NCAAAs.

Sunday, at the Mobil 1 Grand Prix Meet in Fairfax, Va., the Tar Heel women's 3,200-meter relay team won in an NCAA provisional time of 8:51.87. The men's 1,600 relay squad placed first in 3:13.54.
