

With the Churches

The Carrboro Baptist church's daily vacation Bible school will have a preparatory period at 3 p.m. Friday, June 3, at the church. All wishing to enroll are asked to attend.

A Children's Day service will be held at 10 a.m. Sunday, June 5, at the United Congregational Christian church. A number of children, including the junior choir, will take part. A sermon for the entire family will be given by the pastor, the Rev. Richard L. Jackson. No Sunday school will be held that day. Beginning Sunday, June 12, Sunday school will be held at 9:15 and the regular morning worship service at 10 a.m. This schedule will continue through the summer.

The church's daily vacation Bible school, for children from the 3rd to 6th grades in school, will be held from 9 to 11:15 a.m. daily from June 6 to 10, with Mrs. J. E. Ellis as superintendent. All circles of the Women's Fellowship will hold a joint meeting at 8 p.m. Tuesday, June 7, in the church hut. Officers will be elected.

The following condensed history of the Methodist church is on the memorial plates that are being sold by the young people of the church: "Soaring 210 feet aloft in the Chapel Hill sky, the spire of the University Methodist Church provides a distinct physical as well as spiritual landmark in the community. The present church was erected in 1926; however, Methodism has been growing in Chapel Hill since 1843 when the church was first organized as the Bethesda congregation. The first church building was dedicated on July 3, 1853, and served until increasing membership demanded a larger edifice which was erected in 1887, dedicated in 1889, and used continuously until completion of the present church. The University Methodist Church follows the Colonial architectural tradition throughout. During the past century, the church has had 42 ministers and has a membership in 1955 of 750.

Gets Pre-Doctoral Fellowship Robert W. Heath of Chapel Hill is one of four University students who recently received pre-doctoral fellowships in the natural sciences from the National Science Foundation. He completed his undergraduate work in mathematics and is taking advanced work in that field. The fellowship is a renewal of one Heath received last year from the foundation.

Science Academy Honors Felix Hickerson

A professor emeritus of mathematics at the University has been honored, along with three other North Carolina educators, with election as Life Member of the North Carolina Academy of Science. Thomas Felix Hickerson, who retired in 1952 as Kanan Professor of Mathematics, has been announced as one of four Life Members by John A. Yarbrough, Raleigh, Academy secretary-treasurer. "Life membership is reserved for those who have served a long period of years in the group and have reached the point of retirement in their institution," Mr. Yarbrough said, noting that at present 30 persons have been thus honored by the Academy of Science.

Others named along with Mr. Hickerson are E. B. Fulton, department of zoology, N. C. State College; Frederick A. Wolf, department of botany, Duke University, and Miss Elva E. Barrow, department of chemistry, the Woman's College in Greensboro. Professor Hickerson, widely known authority on highway engineering, joined the UNC faculty in 1909 just after receiving his bachelor's degree in civil engineering from the Massachusetts Institute of Technology. He had previously completed his Ph.D. and A.M. degrees at UNC. He taught civil engineering here until the Engineering School was moved to State College, after which he joined the mathematics department. Known also for his many publications and his method for plotting curves, Professor Hickerson worked several years with the State Highway Commission in locating major highways.

Milton Bliss Resigns

Milton Bliss has resigned as choral and band leader at the Chapel Hill high school to join the staff of the Ballard Music Company of Greensboro. His resignation will become effective next week. He had been at school two years. The school band was rated "excellent" in the state music contests both years Mr. Bliss was here.

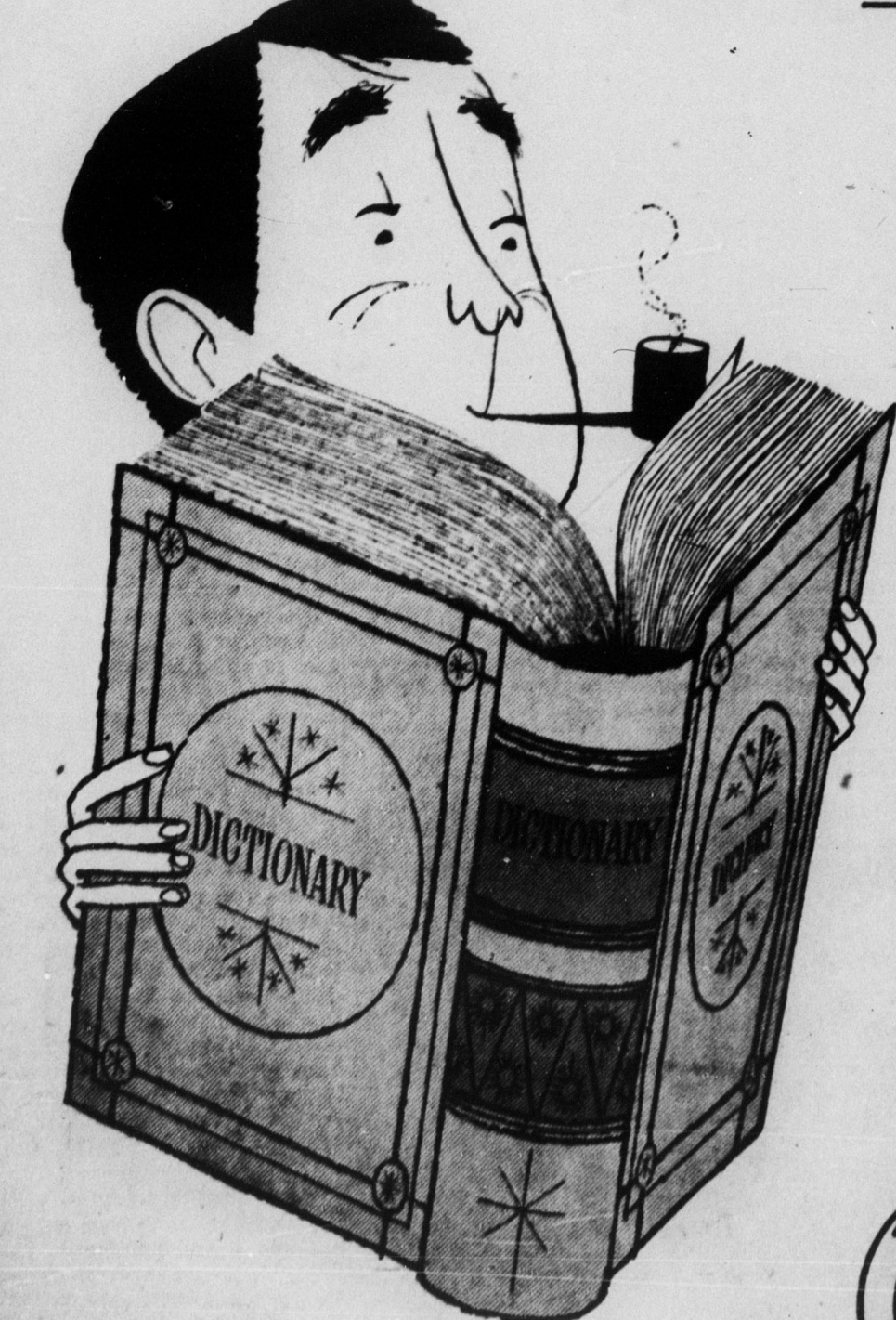
