

Nation's Best College Tennis Players Will Compete Here in U. S. Tournament

Champions and near-champions, the finest undergraduate players in the country, will compete in the National Collegiate tennis championships on the University courts here June 20 to 25. Entries have already been received from 13 schools in practically every section of the country, including a formidable delegation from the West Coast where it is generally conceded that the finest college tennis is played.

The University of California at Los Angeles, winner of the team championship last year and retiring the Penick Bowl, will have its best players here in seeking to get the first leg on the new Ackerman Bowl, which will be in competition for the first time. UCLA will be led by Dick Doss, Jimmy Bead and Joe Blatchford, who are among the coast's best players.

The University of California at Berkeley also has already filed its entry, which includes two celebrated youngsters, Cliff Mayne and Bill Demas.

Michigan, champion of the Big Ten, will feature Barry McKay, whose only loss this year was to Al Kuhn of Northwestern. And Kuhn, the Big Ten singles champion, will be here to represent Northwestern, along with others.

Illinois, Notre Dame, and Indiana are other Midwestern schools which have already sent in entries. Indiana's John Himmels will be among the tournament favorites.

Among the year's undefeated

players who will compete in the week-long tournament, the first national college tennis championship event ever to be held in this area, will be Jose Aguiar of Tulane, with a 13-0 record. Tulane's Ham Richardson won the singles title last year but will not be back to defend as the Rhodes scholar will be in England at the Wimbledon championships, prior to entering Oxford University.

Tennis fans will have an opportunity to size up the comparative merits of college teams in the various sections of the country.

contemplated that between April 12, 1955 (the date of the announcement of the effectiveness of the Salk vaccine) and July 1 (the beginning of the epidemic season) it would be possible to give two doses of the vaccine to all who should have it. To inoculate everybody up to age 20 with two doses would require giving 120,000,000 shots of vaccine before July 1.

Explaining the use of "control" which has been the topic of much

discussion lately, Mr. Basil said "The National Foundation has no authority to control the distribution of the Salk vaccine. It does, however, know what 'control' means and involves because it participated for two polio seasons in the controlled distribution of gamma globulin.

"The only compulsory control that will approach effectiveness is that which involves the Federal Government acquiring by purchase or otherwise all the Salk

vaccine manufactured during some period of time and then allocating it to the states for use through their public health services on terms and conditions which are supported by scientific fact."

To acquire enough vaccine to give three shots to everybody up to age 20 would cost \$144,000,000.

In the last several weeks there has been much discussion about the new Salk polio vaccine. Some light on the subject was given recently in a statement from Basil O'Connor, president of the National Foundation for Infantile Paralysis. Mr. O'Connor said that "the National Foundation with the support of the American people has sponsored the development, testing, and evaluation of a safe polio vaccine which, when properly manufactured, tested, and administered, will be effective in preventing 80 to 90 per cent of paralytic polio cases."
