County Board Working This Week on New Tax Schedule

The Orange County Board of Commissioners last night (Monday) began work on the 1956-57 budget with every intention of holding the tax rate to 70c per \$100 valuation.

The Commissioners last week completed hearings from various county departments on budget requests for the fiscal year beginning July 1. Last night the board sat down and began going over the estimated needs.

They hope to complete the job this week in order that some action may be taken at the July meeting next Monday, July 2, if possible.

One of the commissioners said yesterday that the concensus of the board is to hold the rate at 70c. That still would be an increase of eight cents over the 1955-56 rate of 62c. But it is estimated that at least eight cents will be needed to pay interest on school bonds to e sold before January or on short term bond revenue anticipation notes which might be marketed immediately in place of the bonds.

In addition to the schools, other county departments have requested budget in-The commissioners, however, hope that the increased property valuation will bring in sufficient revenue to meet


