The Chapel Hill-Carrboro Tuberculosis Society will begin its annual sale of Christmas seals for the treatment of tuberculosis within the next few days.

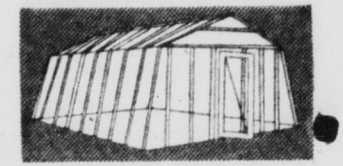
