# School Board Has Two New Faces

The Chapel Hill School Board has seven members, including the chairman, who are elected for six-year terms. The Board is responsible for the school system's financial and other administrative policies. It does not concern itself with teaching techniques or any other purely educational matters, leaving those to Superintendent Howard E. Thompson. Dr. Thompson acts as the Board's executive in policy matters.

Chairman of the School Board is Grey Culbreth, senior member in length of service, and also a former chairman. Mr. Culbreth was appointed to the Board in 1951 for a six-year term, was elected for a two-year term in 1957, and in 1959 was re-elected for another six-year term. He was succeeded in his prior chairmanship by Dr. J. Kempton Jones, whose term expired in July. Mr. Culbreth is the University's superintendent of utilities.

Dr. Fred Ellis, former vice chairman of tre Board, was elected in 1361 for a six-year term. File has been a Chapel Hill resident since 1944 and is a professor of pharmacology at the University School of Medicine. Prior to his election, Dr. Ellis had been unofficially active in Town affairs for some years.

The Rev. J. R. Manley, the first Negro ever to be a member of the School Board, was elected in 1959 for a six-year term. Mr. Manley is pastor of the First Baptist Church in Chapel Hill.

Ben Perry, elected last May to a six-year term, is a Chapel Hill native and a local businessman. He holds a master's degree in education from the University here, and taught and coached in public schools in different parts o fthe State for a number of years before returning to Chapel Hill.

Dr. Richard Peters was elected to the Board in 1961. He is a surgeon at Memorial Hospital and a professor in the University. School of Medicine, and had been unofficially active in Town affairs prior to his election.

Mrs. Ross Scroggs was also elected in 1981, for a four-year term. Mrs. Scroggs is a University employee and the wife of the UNC Photo Lab director. She has been a Chapel Hill resident since 1947, and already had been active in school affairs for a number of years before her election.

Edwin Tenney, a textbook publisher's representative, led the field of School Board candidates last May. Mr. Tenney is a native of Chapel Hill, a University graduate, and has held numerous teaching and administrative positions in education.

Dr. Thompson succeeded former Superintendent Joseph Johnston in the summer of 1962, coming from North Wilkesboro,

where he had been principal of Wilkes Central High School. He has a Ph.D. from the University here and has taught a variety of subjects connected with education in a wide variety of schools and colleges. During World War II Dr. Thompson was an ensign at the Pre-Flight School at the University here.
