#### **Kidney Is Topic Of Lecture Series**

The topic for the annual Medical Lecture Series at the UNC School of Medicine this year will be the kidney. American and European specialists on kidney functions will speak each Saturday morning, beginning September 21, at 11:00 a.m. in the Medical School's Clinic Auditori-

"Each year we study a specific topic in considerable detail," said Dr. Carl W. Gottschalk, one of the program's coordinators. "These men are internationally known for their studies of the kidney." Dr. Louis G. Welt is the other coordinator for the lecture series. The first lecture "Ultrastruc-

ture of the Kidney," will be delivered by Dr. Johannes A. C. Rhodin of the New York University School of Medicine. The second lecture, on "Comparative

Renal Physiology," will be delivered September 28 by Dr. Roy P. Forster of Dartmouth College. Two European kidney specialists taking part in the program will be Dr. Heinrich Wirz of the University of Basel, Switzerland, speaking on the "Mechanism of Urine Concentration and Dilution" November 9, and Dr. Klaus W.

Thurau of the University of Gottingen, Germany, speaking "Renal Hemodynamics and on Correlation with Renal Function," December 14.
