Town Monday, enabling both feasibility study and traffic survey to go ahead.

But the Aldermen's resolution urged speed on the part of the Highway Commission in approving the Thoroughfare Plan, "with the understanding" that the need for the radial road "can be considered at a later date" when the results of the feasibility study and traffic survey are completed.

In other business, the Aldermen agreed to let the current controversy between the Town and developer Jack Carlisle be settled in court.

Mr. Carlisle some weeks ago erected several structures on property in Rolling Hills, described as multi-unit residences, with a building permit which the Board of Adjustment subsequently revoked. Mr. Carlisle would have to have a special use permit for a trailer park, the Board of Adjustment said. Mr. Carlisle took the case to court. It was scheduled to be heard in Orange Superior Court today.

John Manning and Robert Page, attorneys for Mr. Carlisle, appeared before the Aldermen and suggested an out-of-court settlement with the Town amending its ordinances to permit Mr. Carlisle's project. The Aldermen declined.

The Aldermen approved special duty pay of \$100 per man for Chapel Hill policemen who put in more than 1,000 hours of overtime during last summer's racial demonstrations here. The extra pay will be given to men who were on the Chapel Hill police force between May 25 and August 25 if they are still members of the police force.

The Aldermen passed an ordinance governing the construction of driveways, making it unlawful to construct a driveway into the street without a permit from the Building Inspector. The driveway permit will be granted on fulfillment of several conditions, among them that the driveway be no more than 25 feet wide.

Several transmittals from the Planning Board were approved: a final plat of Coker Hills subdivision, a preliminary sketch of development undertaken by Crowell Little, and preliminary sketches of Hillside Estates section II, of Ridgefield Heights sections IV, and Farrington Hills subdivision.

Carlisle's Trailer Hearing Is Today

A hearing on developer Jack Carlisle's appeal of a Board of Adjustment ruling against his mobile homes in Rolling Hills is scheduled for this afternoon in Orange Superior Court.

Mr. Carlisle obtained a writ of certiorari and injunction staying the Town from action against him after the Board of Adjustment revoked building permits for the structures in early October.

Mr. Carlisle had obtained building permits for two five-unit apartment buildings. Town Manager Robert Peck, however, contended that Mr. Carlisle had used the permits to operate a trailer park. The units are pre-fabricated and hauled to sites on a trailer chassis. On that basis Mr. Peck appealed to the Board of Adjustment to rule whether Mr. Carlisle was operating a trailer park or had erected apartment buildings.

The Board of Adjustment ruled that Mr. Carlisle was in effect operating two trailer parks on two separate tracts of land and would have to conform to regulations pertaining

to trailer parks, plus obtaining special use permits.

Mr. Carlisle's attorneys, John Manning and Robert Page, offered to settle the issue out of court, but the Board of Aldermen declined.

Newman To Give Recital Sunday

William S. Newman, Distinguished Alumni Professor of Music at the University, will give a public piano recital Sunday at 8 p.m. in the auditorium of Hill Music Hall.

The recital is free to the public.

Dr. Newman's program will include Brahms' set of Variations on a Theme by Robert Schumann, Op. 9 written in 1854; the only piano sonata left by the Swiss-American composer Ernest Bloch, composed in 1935; J. S. Bach's keyboard Partita, No. 2 in C Minor; "Malaga" from the fourth Iberia Suite by the Spanish composer Isaac Albeniz, based on the popular Andalusian melody known as Malaguena; "The Alcotts" movement from Sonata 2, "Concord, Mass., 1840-1860," by Charles Ives; and Rhapsody in G Minor, Op. 11, No. 1, by the Hungarian composer Ernst Dohnanyi.

A native of Cleveland, Ohio, Dr. Newman has given one or two piano recitals at UNC almost every year since he joined the faculty in 1945. He has given or will be giving the same program this year in other North Carolina cities as well as cities in Virginia, Maryland, Massachusetts, Utah, and Montana.

Currently, Dr. Newman is writing four volumes covering the history of the sonata. The UNC Press recently published "The Sonata in the Classic Era," the second, largest, and most

central of the four volumes projected by Dr. Newman.

Dr. Newman's November 17th piano recital will be the fourth concert in the UNC Department of Music's "Tuesday Evening Series." The recital is being presented on a Sunday to avoid a conflict with a Graham Memorial Student Union-sponsored show scheduled for Tuesday, November 19.
