"We have seven thousand people. They're all packed in, very rich, very poor." Some are very important people, in business or government, entertainment or elumps of thought or observation journalism; one is a streetsweepin the back of your mind. They observe strict silence. Many people are afraid to be by themselves. That's why they have background music and they keep busy all the time. Can't bear to be with themselves. The first year I went on retreat I couldn't find anybody to go along, so I went myself. The next year we had four. Three times a day a monk says a little something, to give you something to think about-things you never even thought of thinking

As he sees it, the influence of the church is best spread not by "trumpeting" publicity of trivia. but by a process he calls "salt-"Salt doesn't benefit anybody if it's still in the salt cellar. 
