The soybeans planted in rows yielded between 25 and 35 bushels per acre, and the broadcast beans yielded between 20 and 25 bushels per acre. The Snipes Brothers feel that this is a good way to utilize their land and labor that is not being used in their dairy operation. The production of soybeans fits into their dairy operation fine, and at the present price of \$2.80 per bushel, they find it profitable and a good crop to 4-H program.
