The North Carolina Folklore Society will meet at the Sir Walter Hotel in Raleigh Friday, Dec. 6, at 2 p.m. to celebrate its 50th anniversary. Dr. A. P. Hudson of Chapel Hill, secretary-treasurer, will review the chief personalities and the highlights of the society's history and will recall the Tercentenary of the Carolina Charter.

Professor Joseph D. Clark of Raleigh will present a paper, "Fifty Years of the North Carolina Folklore Society." Professor Clark has been a member of the society since the 1920s and has held offices in it and presented papers to it.
