10 UNC Scientists Get Heart Grants

Ten scientists at the University School of Medicine received fellowship awards and grants-in-aid totaling \$118,920 from the American and North Carolina Heart Associations during the past year, it was announced today by William Ivey, chairman of the State heart group's board of directors. The grants were among 39 totaling \$257,931, awarded to scientists at various medical re-

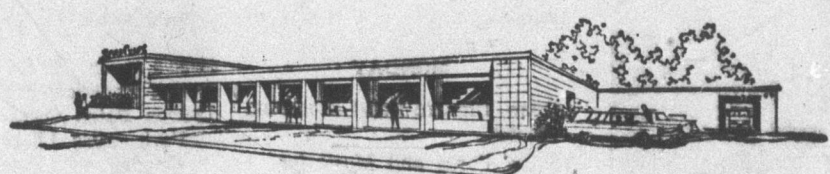
