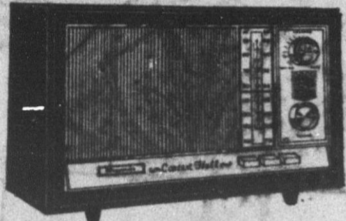

stead of consolidation it is going to cost the townspeople. It costs over \$21,000 more to run two 300-pupil schools than it does to run one 600-pupil school. It costs more to run Frank Porter Graham School, a 12-classroom school, than it does to run Estes Hills, a 24-classroom school.

"We are trying our best to bring the different schools in

Chapel Hill together in every way. You can't have equality in the schools and have different grading scales, different report cards and different textbooks. In the past year we have tried to lessen these differences so that every school operates approximately the same way.

"When a pupil transfers from one school to another in town there is nothing on the transcripts to indicate whether that pupil is white or colored, nor

should it make any difference what color they are. We do not know how many Negro children have been integrated with the white children nor do we intend to find out."

Mrs. Mace, speaking for the Housing Authority, told the Fellowship that part of the original sites chosen for the proposed 60

units of low-rent housing were rejected by the Atlanta Branch of the Federal Housing Authority because the price of the property was too high.

"The Atlanta Authority holds the purse strings," she said, "so we had to comply to their wishes and plan to build on a different tract of land."

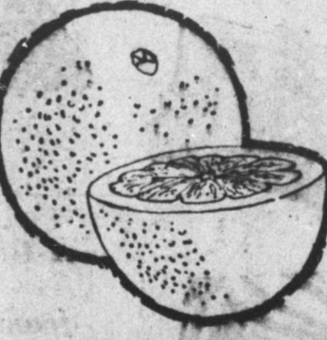
