Rec Commission To Meet Tonight

The Chapel Hill Recreation Commission will complete its organizational processes at its meeting tonight at 8 in the Town Hall. The bylaws committee of the

newly-organized Commission will report on clarifications of and and minor changes in bylaws it submitted for the Commission's consideration at the last meeting.

The Commission will also appoint members to committees if the revised bylaws are approved. The revised bylaws provide for three multi-titled committees instead of several single-responsibility committees: the facilities, and policies; grams, finance and personnel; and long range planning and publicity com-

In other business, the Commission will hear reports from Recreation Director Compton Shelton on the swimming pool at the Roberson Street Center, operation of which the Town officially agreed to take over Monday night; and the Strowd Building on the corner of Columbia and Franklin Streets. The Town Mon-

day authorized \$700 to help pay for renovation of the basement of the building into an uptown recreation center for teenagers. Mr. Shelton said the Recreation Commission would actually spend \$1,000 and labor on the renovation, but that \$300 and the labor would be provided by donations.

The Commission will also discuss the Town Retirement Plan's effect on the Recreation Department. Two members of the Department, the director and the Roberson Street Center supervisor, are eligible to participate in the plan. The Commissions will be responsible for paying their accrued benefits, which total two years' service for the director, less than three months' service for the Roberson Street Center supervisors.

In addition, Mr. Shelton said he planned to make the Commission aware of the facts that the Chapel Hill schools have gymnasium facilities standing idle at times when Recreation Department patrons could be using them; and that many citizens of the Town are interested in basketball programs, for which the schools' gymnasiums could be used.
