A rather slender stockingful of entertainment in Chapel Hill and Carrboro for Christmas week.

MOVIES

Carolina Theater—
Today through Tuesday: "The Wonderful World of the Brothers Grimm." Laurence Harvey, Karl Boehm, Claire Bloom, Walter Slezak, Barbara Eden, Oscar Homolka. Three Grimm fairy tales, with a biographical portion about the fairy tales' authors, Wilhelm and Jacob Grimm, filmed largely on locations in Bavaria and the Rhine Valley. The three tales are "The Dancing Princess" (Yvette Mimieux, Russ Terrilyn, Jim Backus), "The Cobbler and the Elves" (Laurence Harvey, Walter Brooke, the Puppingtons), and "The Singing Bone" (Terry Thomas, Buddy Hackett, Otto Kruger). A good choice for a non-syrupy Christmas movie.

Wednesday through Sunday: "Mutiny on the Bounty" (Brando version), Marlon Brando as Fletcher Christian, Trevor Howard as Captain Bligh, and a lady named Tarita, who wears her sarong at hip level and her lei somewhere around the wishbone, as Maimiti, the Polynesian girl Marlon gets stuck on. Filmed at vast expense of time and money on the islands of Borabora, Moorea and Tahiti, in super thingummy and ultra whatnot. There are a lot of natives and a lot of exciting sea scenes, and Marlon Brando in a naval pigtail is one of the funniest shocks since Yul Brynner shaved. Trevor Howard's Captain Bligh is not exactly Charles Laughton's, but Mr. Howard has his own flavor. Pretty good flick, on the whole. If you don't care for nautical adventure-romance, there are at least no snow scenes to remind you of the weather outside.

Today: "Gypsy." Natalie Wood, Rosalind Russell, Karl Malden. Musical. There was nothing quite like burlesque, including this movie, but it comes as close as it can to the real thing, taking a few pardonable liberties with the life story of Gypsy Rose Lee, without ceasing to be what is known in the trade as family entertainment. Techni-this and that, music by Jule Styne, lyrics by Stephen Sondheim.

Monday: "The Roman Spring of Mrs. Stone." Vivien Leigh, Warren Beatty. "In Rome there is a countess who arranges

things. If you are wealthy and no longer young, like Karen Stone, you cover your shame with perfume and you call the countess." Don't fail to miss it. Tuesday: "The Stripper." Joanne Woodward, Richard Beymer, Claire Trevor, Gypsy Rose Lee. Young man falls in love with somewhat tarnished former friend of young man's mother. Somewhat Tarnished has become an itinerant Stripper, which makes for strained family relations. Not bad, really, but not nearly as flaming as the posters indicate.

Wednesday: "Donovan's Reef." John Wayne, Lee Marvin, Dorothy Lamour, Cesar Romero. Lee Marvin is all right, but don't watch anybody else except Elizabeth Allen, who plays the proper Bostonian girl melting into the Polynesian surroundings.

Thursday: "The Proud and the Profane." William Holden, Deborah Kerr, Thelma Ritter. "A woman betrayed by a man—and her own emotions." Again?

Friday: "The Grass is Greener." Cary Grant, Deborah Kerr, Robert Mitchum, Jean Simmons. "The trouble with house parties is you never can tell which parties will end up playing house." True. It is also true that the grass has become considerably greener since this movie was made.

Saturday: "Kings of the Sun." Yul Brynner, George Chakiris, Shirley Anne Field. Nothing known about it except that it concerns "a lost world turned to a new world of adventure." So kill a couple of hours and 75 cents and find out. At least it's new.

University Issues Policy Statement

The University has issued a policy statement on UNC students' participation in anti-segregation sit-ins.

According to UNC Dean of Student Affairs C. O. Cathey, "the names of all students who have been arrested for trespass and resisting arrest have been forwarded to the office of the student Attorney General who will, upon the final disposition of each case by the North Carolina courts, forward said case to the appropriate student judicial council for action."

Conviction by the University could result in penalties as stiff as expulsion. The statement was issued Friday afternoon following a meeting of the UNC Deans of Men, Women, and Student Affairs, the president and vice president of the student body, and leaders of student judicial councils.

Dean of Men William Long said

that as of Thursday night 28 students had been arrested, some of them more than once, for a total of 34 student arrests. Dean Long said the disparity resulted from some students being arrested, going free on bond, and being arrested again in another sit-in.

The policy statement: "A singular function of the state university is its social responsibility to the total community. This University has traditionally directed efforts for a more perfect realization of the democratic ideals. Such is the duty of the 'State' university as it has been conceived.

"It is apparent that the fabric of democracy is dependent upon its commitment to the necessity of law in the ordering of human activity. The educational institution cannot then condone the willful disobedience of the laws, aside from the merits, demerits, or employment of particular laws. "Consequently, in accordance with established University policy, the names of all students who have been arrested for trespass and resisting arrest have been forwarded to the office of the student Attorney General who will, upon the final disposition of each case by the North Carolina courts, forward said case to the appropriate student judicial council for action."

Dean Cathey said in explanation of the statement that it was "just clearing the atmosphere in case anyone wonders what University policy is. It's nothing new."

STATISTICS COLLOQUIUM

Mr. G. G. J. Van Zyl will address a UNC Statistics Colloquium on Monday, January 6, on "Inventory Models for Perishable Commodities," in 285 Phillips Hall at 4 p.m. The topic of his lecture is part of his doctoral dissertation in which he proposes and analyzes theoretically some inventory models for perishable commodities. This research was motivated by some studies of Professor Robert Elston, formerly of this University, on blood bank inventories at the N. C. Memorial Hospital.
