Wharton Resigns As Head of the Asso. Machinists

WASHINGTON, D. C.—Arthur O. Wharton has resigned from the presidency of the International Association of Machinists, because of ill health.

The Executive Council of the Machinists Association accepted his resignation with profound regret. The retirement becomes effective on November 30.

To succeed Mr. Wharton the council elected Harvey W. Brown, who has been vice president since 1921 and acting president for the past year during Mr. Wharton's leave of absence. Mr. Brown's term will run until a referendum election is held among the membership of the association.

Mr. Wharton is sixty-six years old. He has filled many important positions in the ranks of organized labor and government, in addition to being president of the International Association of Machinists he has been a vice-president of the American Federation of Labor and a member of the Federation's Executive Council since 1930.

A. F. O. FL. MINERS WIN KELLY'S CREEK DECISION

The National Labor Relations Board today ordered Kelley's Creek Colliery Co., Ward, W. Va., to cease discouraging membership in International Union, Progressive Mine Workers of America (AFL), and to reinstate with back pay Eugene Shifflett, discharged by the company for the purpose of discouraging membership in the Progressive Mine Workers.
