He served as General Secretary-Treasurer from 1930 to 1936, when he became General President-Secretary-Treasurer of this International Union of the American Federation of Labor.

He served fifteen years as secretary of the Tennessee Federation of Labor and secretary of the Non-Partisan Campaign Committee of the State Federation of Labor and the Railroad Brotherhoods. He was one of the first advocates of an extensive organization campaign among the Southern workers and served as secretary of the organization committee when the campaign was inaugurated. He likewise was field representative for the American Federation of Labor and his own International Union.

Mr. Birthright has served the American Labor Movement with intense zeal and intelligent leadership. He has always been a strong supporter of the Union Label cause and has laid special emphasis on Union services which are designated by Shop Cards and Service Buttons.

BARBERS' UNION CARD

Beginning with the Cigar Makers in 1875, a large number of American Labor Unions adopted a Union Label. The Journeymen Barbers' International Union of America, almost from the time of its founding in 1887, has used such an emblem. The devices included under the term Union Label are three in number: A Label proper, a Shop Card, and a Button. Most Unions choose a Union Label, but the barbers decided on a Shop Card. Placed in the window of a shop, the Card is the most effective form for the Barbers' Union.

This Card is displayed only where good, competent Union barbers are employed. Patronize no other. It is printed in black, red, blue, and gold.



BEAUTICIAN WINDOW CARD

At present the Journeymen Barbers have their own Union Shop Card and the Hairdressers and Cosmetologists' (beauticians) Department of the Union has a separate Union Shop Card. This Card is displayed only where expert, competent Union beauticians are employed. Patronize no other. It is printed in mauve, buff, and black.

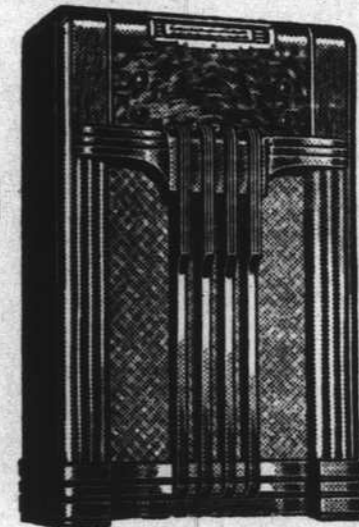

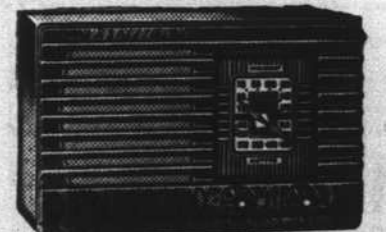
