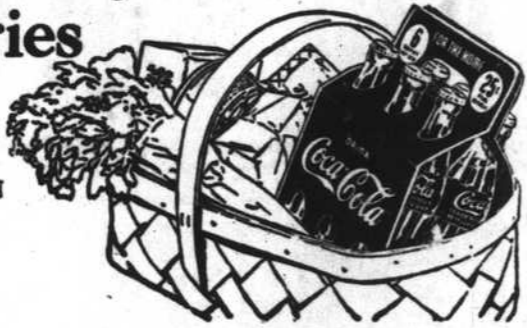

## Labor Contributes \$200,000 To Finns Says Matthew Woll

NEW YORK, March 4.—Matthew Woll, vice-president of the American Federation of Labor and national chairman of the Finnish relief fund's labor division, announced that organized labor and industrial, banking and business employes had contributed more than \$200,000 to the fund. Dr. Alexander S. Lipsett, national director of the labor division, said that 95 per cent of all union contributions were in small amounts ranging from \$5 to \$15.

## Typographical Union In Monthly Meeting On Sunday March 3

Charlotte Typographical Union No. 338, held its regular monthly meeting Sunday afternoon in the K. of P. hall on South Tryon street. President Henry A. Stalls presided. The meeting was largely attended and the regular routine was gone through.

The following resolution, bearing upon the A. F. of L. ruling, regarding non-payment of a special assessment was passed by the body:

"Be it Resolved, That Charlotte Typographical Union No. 338, accept the mandate of the American Federation of Labor and preserve its dignity by withdrawing further affiliation, dues or fees from the said A. F. of L., or any of its subordinate bodies until such time as a legitimate and complete reaffirmation shall have been accomplished."

A number of "Whereases" preceded the "Be it Resolved," which was the sum substance of it all. Secretary Sykes made his usual financial report, while Secretary Beatty handled the recording secretary's duties.

## AFL PRO-CHURCH GREEN DECLARES

The American Federation of Labor is distinctly pro-church and is every interested in promoting the religious life of its members and in aiding churches, it was asserted Saturday, in Atlanta by President William Green upon arrival here.

Conventions on Sunday occupy... Often speakers from A.F.L. conventions on Sundays occupy the pulpits of every church in cities where the sessions are being held, Mr. Green said. "It is a custom we have maintained for more than half a century."
