A statistical study of the motion picture industry showed:
Its estimated worth is over \$2,000,000,000;
One hundred film companies employ 28,500 persons;
Ninety-five per cent of the film producers are in California, and the rest in New York;
Seventeen thousand theaters show films, with a capacity of 10,462,208 persons at one time;
Film-goers pay about \$1,000,000,000 a year for admission;
Theatres employ 241,000 persons and pay \$250,000,000 annually for the rental of films;
The industry spends \$77,000,000 in the United States and \$33,000,000 abroad each year to advertise its products in newspapers and magazines.
