Industrial Strife At A Minimum Says Sec. Perkins

CLEVELAND, Oct. 9.—Secretary of Labor Frances Perkins predicted Tuesday a minimum of industrial strife during production under the national defense program.

"Most strikes called during the World war were based on demands for union recognition and the eight-hour day," the Labor Secretary said in a talk before the A. F. L. Brotherhood of Bookbinders in convention here.

"These issues aren't major problems any more."
Miss Perkins estimated 6,000,000 jobs would be provided, directly or indirectly, by the defense program in the coming year.
